

What does the mentoring consist of?

The staff of CCC work closely with !IMPACT disciples to mentor them in the various ministry activities, projects, and day-to-day responsibilities of church life. This includes pastoral and youth ministry, multi-media, evangelism, tutoring/mentoring, administrative duties, special events planning, grounds and maintenance, and so on. Disciples also serve during Sunday services and assist with special events.

What will the mission trip consist of?

A requirement for graduation is a ten-day, short-term mission trip to Central or South America held at the end of the program. The discipleship program provides specific classes to prepare disciples to share their faith and meet the cultural and religious challenges of the trip.

What is the cost for the !IMPACT discipleship program?

The cost of the discipleship program is \$1,200 per year, which includes course training, class handouts and notes. The disciple is expected to pay for application fees, book fees and raise the money for the mission trip separately.

Disciples wanting to participate in the Logos degree program will pay an additional \$1,025 plus application and graduation fees.

What if I attend a different church?

All young adults who meet the requirements for acceptance are welcome in !IMPACT. Further, disciples may complete their ministry involvement and mentoring in their own local church if their church leadership can accommodate the requirements. Please contact us for further details.

Young Adult Discipleship Program

What is the !IMPACT discipleship program?

!IMPACT is a nine-month intensive discipleship program for one or two years designed for young adults who seek to make an impact on their generation.

Why is the discipleship program needed?

Deliberate hostility against Christians is a growing trend in every area of society, especially within secular universities. Attacks against unprepared young adult Christians have resulted in many leaving the church or even abandoning their faith. As a result, it is no longer an option for the Church to disciple its young adults in a Christian worldview.

What are the goals and benefits of the !IMPACT discipleship program?

The strategic goals of the discipleship program are to prepare young men and women to face the challenges confronting Christianity and be able to “give an answer to everyone who asks to give the reason for the hope that you have” (1 Pt. 3:15). The program provides intensive training for those individuals who have a passionate desire to serve the purposes of God in their generation and to prepare them to become successful Christian leaders in the local church and society.

What are the components of !IMPACT?

The discipleship program is made up of three cutting-edge components:

- Online and In-Class Courses Providing Christian Apologetics, Worldview, Ethics, Bible Doctrine and Theology
- Mentoring and Discipleship with Church Staff and Engaging in Church Ministry
- Short-term Mission Trip

When will the !IMPACT program begin?

Orientation will take place the last weekend in August. For first year disciples, the school year consists of three trimesters; second year students have two semesters. The school year begins the first week in September and ends mid-June. Graduation is held after the last week.

What courses will be offered?

First year courses include Hands-on Bible Study, Bible Covenants, Introduction to the Bible, Cults and World Religions, Gospel of John, Apologetics, New Testament Survey and more. Second year courses include Ethics, Letters of Paul, Romans, Spiritual Formations, Systematic Theology, and the Kingdom of Heaven.

Are the courses in class or online?

!IMPACT makes use of both in-class and online courses to enhance the learning experience.

Are the courses accredited?

We partner with Logos University to offer a degree program option for an Associate of Applied Theology for completion of the requirements for the first year of the !IMPACT program. Although Logos is not a regionally-accredited institution, their degree programs have been successfully transferred into other Bible College and Seminary programs should the student desire to continue his or her education elsewhere.
