

Pastor's Column



Well here we are having made it through another blessed Christmas Season of our Christian Church. And now we are in the Season After The Epiphany in what the church calls Ordinary Time. The First Sunday focuses on the Baptism of Christ

and the Last Sunday on the Transfiguration.

This season includes four to nine Sundays, depending on the date of Easter. We will be celebrating nine this year, ending on March 6, Transfiguration Sunday. And then we start the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on March 9.

Remember what we said about Ordinary Time? After each cycle, (the Christian year contains two cycles; The Christmas Cycle and the Easter Cycle), there is an "ordinary time" of growth symbolized by the color green.

During the Epiphany season, the manifestation of Christ increasingly unfolds. The Magi follow the star to the Christ Child; Jesus is baptized and receives affirmation of his Messiahship from his Father; He proclaims the gospel, and finally His Transfiguration is completed.

Our travels take us now into the Lenten Season. A season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9, and ends on Holy Saturday, April 23.

Okay then, now you have your itinerary all set for the next two months. We will be making some stops along the way. One of which is an eleven week Short-Term Disciple Bible Study-Invitation to John. The invitation from Christ is: "Come and see, follow Me".

Experience the magnificent passages in John including the I am statements (I am the truth, the life and the way; I am the living water and more). Participants do not have to have an in-depth knowledge of the Bible to enjoy and benefit from participation. The study commences on Thursday, January 27, 2011, and I am looking forward to having you along for the journey.

Tucson services call all to be 'agents of hope'

TUCSON, Ariz. — Children can lead adults to become agents of hope, Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño told those who had gathered to remember the dead and pray for the living. The Jan. 11 vigil was among many interfaith gatherings held in response to a Jan. 8 shooting rampage, which left six dead and more than a dozen wounded.

UMCOR cited as 'Top Ten' Haiti relief fundraiser

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti — The United Methodist Committee on Relief is among the top 10 charities raising money for Haiti earthquake relief, according to the Chronicle of Philanthropy. "Ten charities have accounted for more than 75 percent of all donations raised to benefit the 2010 Haiti earthquake," the Chronicle reported. Overall, the charities have raised more than \$1.4 billion for Haiti. UMCOR, which raised \$43 million, was No. 9. The American Red Cross was first with \$479 million in donations.
