#### "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." Matthew 28: 19a



#### PERSON OF FAITH STEFFANI GLYGOROFF

Steffani Glygoroff was born in Pontiac, Michigan residing there until her 9th birthday when her family moved to Rochester. Her dad worked for Michigan Bell Telephone as an engineer retiring from company after a long career. Mom referred to herself as a domestic engineer even wearing a sweat shirt with this title. Steffani was an only child.

As for her education, Steffani attended Pontiac schools through the 3rd grade switching to Rochester schools 4th-12th grades. She graduated from Rochester High school in 1973 being in the first class to attend the new building for 4 years. Northern Michigan University was Steffani's home for her schooling the first 4 years of college majoring in music education. She transferred her credits to Wayne State University earning a double major degree in psychology and music education. Her student teaching experience was in Utica.

Taking a break from her schooling, Steffani worked at K-Mart headquarters in Informational Systems for thirteen years. Once she earned her degree from Wayne State University, she taught music 4th-12th grades for 2 years in the Brimley school system in the U.P.

Returning to live in Rochester, Steffani has worked as Director of Music Ministry at the Congregational church and now at Marshall Music Company in Troy teaching flute and piano for the past eleven years.

Her interests and hobbies are: music, reading mystery books, doing needle work, crocheting, and collecting old piano sheet music from the early 1900's. Steffani is musically talented as she plays numerous instruments: flute, string bass,

piano, guitar, ukulele, auto harp and bells.

During her high school days, she won a Tuesday Musicale scholarship to attend Interlochen and then a music scholarship to attend Northern Michigan University. Other music awards were earned at festivals.

Steffani is not one to travel much. Most of her travels have been to music conferences through the Sigma Alpha Iota Fraternity - a professional music organization. She has been to Las Vegas, Denver, Disneyland, and Philadelphia. Plus short journeys around Michigan and to Indiana where her parents are buried. Her favorite means of travel is by train.

How did Steffani find Paint Creek? A lady told her that Paint Creek allowed dogs so she decided to check out this unique church by driving by to see the outside. Liking what she saw on the outside, Steffani decided to attend a service June 26, 2016. She immediately fell in love with the inside quaintness of the church. What she likes about Paint Creek is "that it is just one big family."

In less than a year, Steffani has become very involved in church activities starting out in the choir and on the nominating committee. She has since agreed to becoming Choral Music Coordinator, Worship chairperson and on Church Council. Earlier this year, Steffani began Lay Servant classes finishing the basic class and being commissioned April 2. Her other activities have included: Wednesdays Upper Room Devotional group and Bible study with the pastor. Starting in September, she will begin directing the choir. Obviously this outstanding lady has made a serious commitment to Paint Creek since joining as a member.

One other note of interest about Steffani is her love of

animals. She wanted to include in her story that she has rescued all the pets she has ever owned. Her present family member is Melody, a 6 year old cat, who greets her daily when returning home.

This ends Steffani Glygoroff's Person of Faith story. As you can see, she is an amazing lady who we are pleased found her way to Paint Creek church.
