THE VALUE OF CHRISTIAN FRIENDSHIP...

Have you ever noticed that the world's value system leaves a little to be desired? Have you noticed the misplaced emphasis that Washington and Hollywood place on power? Have you noticed the focus in the advertising outlets that is placed on accruing money and possessions?

We hear so much in the news about the dollar losing its value and the price of gold climbing higher and higher. The world shakes and trembles every time a new report comes out about the value of financial assets.

It seems today that many people, including Christians, have lost sight of what is truly valuable. This same warped value system is being taught to the next generation. Soon we will have, if we do not already have, a generation of young people that know the monetary cost of everything but understand the value of nothing.

Through the microscope of Scripture, we can see the world around us as it truly is. Through the perfect view of Scripture, we see our own heart thoughts, motivations, and intentions for what they truly are. Psalm 119:104 says, "Through thy precepts I get understanding: therefore I hate every false way."

Only the Scripture can

pierce through the haze of confusion that the devil would lay before our path. When viewed through God's Word, it is clear that the value system of the world falls far short of what the Bible says is of worth.


