AND FOR THE SUPPORT OF THIS DECLARATION...

Benjamin Franklin once said, "Give me twenty-six soldiers, and I will conquer the world." He was speaking, of course, of the letters of the alphabet. He was speaking of the power of words.

Words encourage and inspire. Words inform and educate. Words give hope of a new tomorrow. It was the words of the Declaration of Independence that joined thirteen rag-tag colonies in a fight for freedom against the greatest superpower in the world.

Most of us are familiar with the beginning lines of the Declaration of Independence. "When in the course of human events...We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness."

Thomas Jefferson continued on to write out a specific list of grievances against the King of England. He affirmed the rights of the colonies to govern themselves and their independence from the British Crown.

Then he wrote something which perhaps we take little notice of or perhaps have never noticed at all. "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor."

The Declaration of Independence is filled with words of resolve, words of finality. Our Founding Fathers were saying, "Win or lose, this is where we stand." These were words of truth and consequence.

But notice also that these were not words left to stand alone. They were words backed by passion and raw courage. They were empowered by the innate desire of the human soul to be free.

DID YOU EVER WONDER WHO DESIGNED THE CURRENT AMERICAN FLAG?

The man credited with designing the American flag is Robert Heft. He earned his place in history in 1958, while living with his grandparents in Ohio.

His updated fifty-star flag was a class project later adopted by presidential proclamation after Alaska and before Hawaii was admitted to the union in 1959. Since Heft's flag was made public, he's been in all fifty states and thirty-seven foreign countries, making hundreds of speeches and traveling more than one hundred thousand miles a year. Heft also has been the guest of nine U.S. presidents at the White House.

Heft is the former eighttime mayor of Napoleon, Ohio and has served as president of the state's Mayor's Association. During his career, Heft taught at Northwest State Community College and also works as a real estate broker. Heft's stars and stripes design has been the second longest serving design since the nation's founding.

As a seventeen year old high school junior, Heft found himself in need of a class project. His proposed flag idea was initially turned down by the teacher.

was standing in front of my class to give my speech. I was petrified.

You weren't allowed to have your speech in front of you for your final grade. Everything had to be said from memory. The teacher wanted expression in your voice and on your face. It was so hard for me to do! If I did one or both of those, then I couldn't remember the speech!

Only a couple of things got me through the speech each year. One was knowing that I had to do it. There was no way of getting out of it. For some reason, Mom and Dad always backed the teacher instead of me.

The other was knowing that Mom and Dad were pleased that I had done it. They weren't particularly concerned with my acting skills. They were more concerned that I learned to obey them and the teacher with the right attitude. I did not want to recite that speech. Not because I didn't want to do a good job, but because I thought I couldn't.

Sometimes we are so afraid to witness to the lost around us. We're afraid we won't do a good job giving the speech. We're afraid that we might say the wrong thing, and they won't like us.

Sometimes it doesn't go as perfectly as we planned it in our heads. Sometimes, maybe we do say the wrong thing. But witnessing is not the same as giving a speech about someone in history that we have never met. Witnessing is telling someone of the Savior who has changed our lives so completely.

We can be a witness in the power of the Holy Spirit. We can take the truth of the Gospel and introduce people to the Christ that can save them. The Gospel isn't a speech. It's a Person. Some Christians say, "I know all of that, but I'm still so nervous. I'm not a good speaker." Well, Moses tried that. God didn't let him out of it either.

You can be a witness. You can tell others how Christ forgave your sin and saved you from hell. The Lord even said He would go with you in Matthew 28:18-20.

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I command you: and, lo, *I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world.* Amen."



He went ahead and finished his project, receiving a B minus for his efforts. Heft's teacher compromised and promised to deliver a better classroom grade if he could get the U.S. Congress to accept his flag. The rest is history.

Now retired, Heft spent thirty years as a teacher. He has served eight terms as Mayor of Napoleon, Ohio and twenty-five years as a real estate broker. Born in Saginaw, Michigan, but raised in Ohio, Heft recently returned to his native city and is the Education Manager for the Saginaw County Junior Achievement Board. He is also active in Habitat for Humanity and the Lion's

Club.
