Lessons from Aquila and Priscilla

Does God ever lie? Will God ever change? Will the Bible ever change? These may be some questions that you have. There are some Bible verses that can help us answer these questions. Let's take the first question. Look in your Bible at Hebrews 6:18. The Bible tells us that God cannot lie. The verse uses the word "immutable" which means no one can argue with this truth. It also means that God will not change. He is "the same yesterday, and today, and for ever." (Hebrews 13:8) The Bible is God's Word to us. Since God cannot change and He is the same, then the Bible will not change. Psalm 119:89 tells us that God's Word is settled. This word settled means that it is complete. God has preserved His Word for us through the years. He has preserved His Word for English speaking people in the King James Bible. In 2011, we celebrated the 400 years that we have had the King James Bible.
