Endeavoring to walk in the footsteps of the New Testament, Aquila and Priscilla husband and wife teaching team, Steve and Rebekah Lilly strive to serve the Lord together teaching the teacher and training the trainer in local churches. AN EVANGELISTIC TOOL FOR THE LOCAL CHURCH
