

Royce had not been paid in several months and there was not enough money to meet The Voice in the Wilderness giving that month, the next, nor the next. Praise the Lord, He did see us through those difficult days. Currently, all our bills are paid in full, yet I must report that many months we are just not able to give our missionaries the funds needed to meet our projected missions budget. The



amounts for these missionaries are modest comparatively speaking. However, it grieves me deeply when funds are not sufficient. I receive letters daily from ministries requesting a donation from The Voice in the Wilderness, Inc. Almost without exception, these organizations take in more money per month than The Voice in the Wilderness, Inc. receives annually. As Bro. Royce said, "The Voice in the Wilderness operates on a shoestring budget." It should be illegal, but the Federal government makes information, addresses, etc., available, which at minimum, creates a lot of aggravation. Both Bro. Royce and I weekly receive phone calls and letters from individuals wanting grants, education money, even cars and funds to start a business. It is frustrating as Bro. Royce expresses in this recent letter:

Dear Williamsons: This typewriter is gone but I have worked on it a bit and will try it this time. I have a new one ordered but it is slow in coming. Thus the delay. About the unwanted letters, I don't know where they are coming from but [they] are still coming. Almost two years after the first gift, the two became one in a beautiful early morning ceremony. Off to Paris for a ten-day honeymoon, and the start of a romance that was truly an ordained partnership. From lofty heights of ministry to plunging valleys where



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each must draw on the other, their love was their love for their Lord. Those years without a cloud, phenomenal success rose to the failing health of one and then the other. In sickness. invalidism, and even depression, their devoted love flowed ever sweeter. deeper, and more precious. After twenty years as husband and wife he wrote, "My heart flies to you. I love you now as then, only multiplied many times. I have served the Lord far more and never less for your sweet companionship! Bless your dear heart!.... You are the precise form in which God would make a woman for such a man as I..." 1

Susannah was a powerful inspiration to her husband. He would weep at her feet from exhaustion and the depressive load he bore. She was comfort and ministered he said as an angel from God with her faith, strength, and courage.

She called him Tirshatha. This was her name of endearment meaning, "Your Reverence." Who was this amazing couple? He wrote this incredible description about his beloved: "She delights in her husband. in his person, his character, his affection; to her, he is not only the chief and foremost of mankind, but in her eves, he is all in all. Her heart's love belongs to him and to him only. He is her little world, her Paradise, her choice treasure. She is glad to sink her individuality in his. She seeks no renown for herself; his honor is reflected upon her, and she rejoices in it. She will defend his name with her dying breath; safe enough is he where she can speak for him. His smiling gratitude is all the reward she seeks. Even in her dress she thinks of him and considers nothing beautiful which is distasteful to him. He has many objects in life, some of which she does not quite understand; but she believes in them all, and anything she can do to promote them, she delights to perform... Such a wife, as a true spouse, realizes the model marriage relation, and sets forth what our oneness with the Lord ought to be!" ² Such was a veiled description of Susannah by her husband.

The sad day came when she followed behind her beloved husband's casket. The grief was so great until she remembered his sweet words of cheer when he must be away in travels: "Seeing me look so sad, he tenderly said, 'What! Crying over your lamb, wifie? Do you think the children of Israel stood and wept over the lamb they laid on His altar?""

Then the heart of Susannah found peace in tears. She looked at the great portrait of Tirshatha over the mantel and sobbed? "Ah, sweetheart! Was there ever one like thee? In all these forty years I knew thee, thou wert most tender, gracious! And now I am parted from thee, not for a few days only, as in that long ago time, but 'until the day break and the shadows flee away!' I think I hear thy loving voice saving again, "Don't cry over your lamb, wifie,' as I try to give thee up, ungrudgingly to God—not without tears—ah, no, that is not possible; but with that full surrender of heart which makes the sacrifice acceptable in His sight.3

Who are they? This is the beautiful love story of Susannah and Charles Haddon Spurgeon.

MUSIC AND WORSHIP—BLENDED WORLD



Dr. Hugh Pyle writes – "Bad music always leads to compromise, heartache and bad living. Those who were considered the best of Christian contemporary entertainers led the way. Amy Grant "crossed over" into secular rock. She also is divorced. Sandi Patti was soon divorced; Michael W. Smith fell into adultery – and that was just the beginning. Now the broken lives and marriages of many modern church music and youth leaders are scattered along the way.

"Only God knows how many Christian young people are jamming with the beat of this world when they could have been led into consecrated living and a soul-winning testimony if they had been taught good music and the Bible truths of the great hymns and gospel songs of bygone revival days.

"Many orthodox churches still preach the Gospel and teach at least

some bible truth in the main auditorium, but out in the "youth building" it sounds like Hollywood, Vegas and Nashville.

"What will the church of tomorrow be like?"

T.H. Parrow writes in the *Gospel Standard*, "Music is a very powerful medium by which much is taught, dramatized and symbolized. Music is the medium that mirrors the soul.

If the soul be sensual, so will the music be. If the soul be rebellious, then the music will be revolutionary.

If they would be spiritually minded, then the music will be characterized by godliness.

"He describes the "musical mush" many fundamental churches have brought to their churches to get crowds of worldlings to come and be entertained, saying that it reflects the spiritual condition of the souls of many religious leaders today...

"Contemporary praise choruses are so vague that they could be sung to any false god." *Source: The Sword of the Lord 3/12/04*

David Wells in Losing Our Virtue writes — "The purpose of worship is clearly to express the greatness of God and not simply to find inward release or, still less, amusement. Worship is theological rather than psychological... In the large majority of praise songs I analyzed, 58.9 percent offer no doctrinal grounding or explanation for the praise. In classical hymnody I examined it was hard to find hymns that were not predicated upon and did not develop some aspect of doctrine."

James Montgomery Boice in Gospel of Grace? - "One of the saddest features of contemporary worship is that the great hymns of the church are on the way out. And in their place have come trite jingles that have more in common with contemporary advertising ditties than with the Psalms... The compositions of Luther, Wesley and Watts are clearly better than the repetitious babble of so many writers of today's ubiquitous praise choruses. Why should we commit ourselves So tenaciously to what is manifestly poor?"

Sermon of the Month N THE HOME FRONT"

Ephesians 5:21-32

What a joy and blessing to see a beautiful marriage and family serving the Lord Jesus Christ with the sweet presence of the Holy Spirit so evident. Yes, it is possible today. Even in such a crazy and confusing age, husband and wife, Mom, Dad and children can enjoy all the riches God intended for the home.

The late Dr. M.R. DeHaan, Bible teacher and medical doctor stated, "The nearest thing to heaven on this earth is the Christian family and the home where husband and wife, and parents and children, live in love and peace together for the Lord and for each other. The nearest thing to hell on earth is an ungodly home, broken by sin and iniquity, where parents bicker, quarrel and separate, and children are abandoned to the devil and all the forces of wickedness."

A Godly, happy home is no accident. Day by day the practice of biblical principles in the life of a couple committed to faith in Jesus Christ will result in the blessed marriage our Lord ordained.

I. Examine your own heart and relationship with Christ.

Dear Sir, Madam, do you know Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior? This decision and commitment is absolute to a successful marriage and home. Acknowledge your sin, repent of your sin, and by faith receive forgiveness and salvation through Jesus Christ. How can good come out of a heart that's bad? Get your heart right with God. (Romans 10:9-10)

II. The family that prays together stays together.

Prayer cannot be trivialized or

minimized as to the importance in all of life's endeavors. Communion and worship are essential. Prayer is stillness before the Lord. Prayer is coming apart from this world before you come apart because of this world. Prayer is allowing the Lord to speak to us before we speak to others and say the wrong thing. Prayer is part and parcel to the victorious armor needed by every believer (note v18 of Ephesians 6:1-18). A prayerless day is to neglect faith maintenance, is to omit God and in effect pray "Lord I don't need you today, I can go it alone!" Martin Luther said, "To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing."

III. Don't look for the right person, be the right person.

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

"If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us." I John 1:9 & 10.

Do we not love to blame? Just go ahead and point that long old finger. It is somebody else's fault. None of us like to accept responsibility, not to speak of face the consequences. It is a full time job keeping my own business right much less tending to someone else's. By the way, John also said, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us (I John 1:8). Have you considered the beam that is in your eye? (Matthew 7:3-5)

IV. Cleanliness is next to what?

We had a guest preacher staying in our home. He remarked one morning while standing in the kitchen, "Sister Williamson, the top of your refrigerator is clean!" Well, being over 6 feet tall, he could see the top of most refrigerators and commented that rarely had a refrigerator top been wiped down in most of the homes he visited in.

When we relocated The Voice in the Wilderness corporate office from Dallas to North Carolina, Sister Sophie Muller's niece had a friend who was a Realtor. Through this individual we spent several days a week, for months, looking at various properties. My wife and I were shocked at the "lack of housekeeping." Even when an owner knew, in advance, we were coming to look at their house the place would still be "in a wreck!" Not only were clothes, and dishes and things out of order, house after house after house was absolutely filthy. I cease to be amazed these days at how few real housekeepers there are.

Then, it's amazing how many men and women simply let their appearance go shortly after they are married. Talk about gaining weight, bad hair days and just simply... well, let's stop there.

After children come along, what kind of character, discipline and work ethic are we teaching? Parents, a blessing you can pass on to your child that will benefit them personally, their family in years to come and prove to be a tremendous asset to their local church is that of a strong work ethic!

Rand Hummel of THE WILDS wrote this outline: "Work! Work! Work! Work! Most of us do not like to say that word very loud. Sometimes we have this idea that the perfect situation would be a life of leisure and *no work!* Haven't our parents taught us that "Hard work never killed anyone! Let's take a few minutes

CHURCHES ANSWERING

NOT THEIR

PHONES – Churches must make it easy for people to contact them. If potential visitors or people seeking spiritual help for themselves or their loved ones are frustrated when they attempt to contact the church and the pastor, they will usually go somewhere else. A survey done by Barna Research Group in December 2003 found that it is very difficult to get in touch with churches. They called 3.400 Protestant churches five different times over a two-week period during normal business hours, making sure that the calls were made at various times of the day. A human being could not be reached at 55% of the churches. In 20% of the cases, the phone went unanswered by either a person or an answering machine in each of the five separate attempts (Worthy News, Jan. 27). Churches not only should have an answering machine or voice mail but also should return calls quickly. Callers should be encouraged to leave their phone number with the promise that someone will return the call quickly. It is crucial that the phone messaging system be checked frequently and that calls are returned. If the pastor does not have a full-time secretary. he should seek volunteers who can

help him on a part-time basis with important tasks like this. This can be a matter of spiritual life or death. O Timothy Magazine Vol. 21, Issue 3, 2004 [Now, may I add a side note. In traveling across the U.S., often my family and I have stopped to find a church to attend for services when not scheduled to speak for The Voice in the Wilderness. However, when calling the churches, the recording simply gives the name of the church and requests you to leave a message. It would be helpful, especially if no one is monitoring the voice mail on a timely schedule, to at least give the church times of worship, Sunday School, Bible Study, etc.]

SCRIPTURE TWISTING -

Homosexuality and the Western Christian Tradition is a book by Derrick Bailey, which argues that the verb "yadah" ("know") used in Genesis 19:5 should be translated "to get acquainted." With this in mind, Bailey explained that the men of Sodom simply wanted to "become acquainted with the men in Lot's house." Their continued insistence on "getting acquainted with" these visitors was a serious violation of the accepted code of hospitality. In short, Sodomites were being inhospitable. (Derrick Bailey, "Homosexuality and the Western Christian Tradition," reprint, Hamden, CT: The Shoestring Press, Inc., 1975)

The Scriptural record is quite

different, and the clear intent of the men of Sodom is not arguable. Still, willing to escape any biblical disapproval, men will go to almost any lengths to explain away the obvious. Some have used the term "scripture twisting" to describe what Bailey and others are doing. Another term used is "scriptural acrobatics," but with no trapeze, high wire, or net. TBC 3/20/04

MUSLIMS SEEK CHRSTIANS' FAVOR WITH 'JESUS' AD – A controversial Islamic lobby group has published an ad in California newspapers seeking to win acceptance with the message that Muslims "respect and revere Jesus" as do Christians. The ad is headlined "More In Common Than You Think." The ad, quoting from

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Islam's book the Quran, reads: "Behold (O Mary!) The Angel said, God has chosen you, and purified you, and chosen you above the women of all nations. O Mary, God gives you good news of a word from Him, whose name shall be the Christ (Masih or Messiah), Jesus son of Mary, honored in this world and in the hereafter, and one of those brought near to God." (Holy Qur'an, 3:45)

"Like Christians, Muslims respect and revere Jesus. Islam teaches that Jesus is one of the greatest of God's prophets and messengers to humankind."

"Like Christians, every day, over 1.3 billion Muslims strive to live by his teachings of love, peace, and forgiveness. Those teachings, which have become universal values, remind us that all of us, Christians, Muslims, Jews, and all others have more in common than we think."

Muslims point out, however, that they reject the Christian belief in Jesus' divinity and regard him only as a prophet. Muhammad, in fact, is considered by Muslims to be superior to Jesus because Islam's founder is believed to have brought God's final revelation. World Net Daily 3/30/04

the plan of salvation also includes those who acknowledge the Creator in the first place amongst whom are the Moslems: these profess to hold the faith of Abraham, and together with us they adore the one, merciful God, mankind's judge on the last day..." page 367.

"I find it tragic that they [Vatican Council] say[s] the Muslims worship the One True God. Allah is NOT the same as the God of Abraham, Isaac

and Jacob. Allah is not a Trinity, first of all. Allah happens to be the name of the moon god-the chief idol in the Ka'abah in Mecca where they go now for their pilgrimages. They had over 300 idols there, and Allah was the name of the chief idol. So, although Muhammed smashed the idols, he still maintained the name of the chief idol - the moon god - which is why they have the crescent moon as their symbol [for Islam]... EMERGING CHURCHES: LOOSELY **MERGING** PROTESTANTISM, CATHOLICISM, AND THE **WORLD** - Congregations known as "emerging" or "postmodern" are springing up in many parts of the USA. Though widely diverse in doctrine and practice, these youth orientated churches are characterized by a loose, non-dogmatic approach to theology, a rock & roll style of worship, and often an acceptance of some Catholic and Orthodox liturgical practices such contemplative prayer and candles. In "Hip New Churches Pray to a Different Drummer" (New York Times, Feb. 18), John Leland observes that these churches "represent the next wave of evangelical worship, after the boom of mega churches in the 1980s and 1990s." Solomon's Porch in Minneapolis uses pieces of pastry for the Lord's Supper. The Scum of the Earth in Denver features pizza and a D.J. At Ecclesia in Houston and Vintage Faith Church in Santa Cruz, Calif., "artists in the congregation paint during services, in part to bring mystical or nonrational elements to

worship." Bluer in Minneapolis features the aforementioned Orthodox practices. The leader of Bluer, John Musick, says that these practices "represent stability." In reality, such practices represent apostasy. Those who desire true stability must go all the way back to the apostolic churches of the New Testament, and the faith we see there does not need icons and art and candles and incense and formal liturgy. True Christian faith is not derived from nor assisted by such things; it is based strictly upon God's Word the Scriptures (Rom. 10:17). O Timothy Magazine Vol. 21, Issue 3. 2004

AMERICAN LAW ONLY, **PLEASE** – A resolution has recently been introduced in Congress called "Reaffirmation of American Independence Resolution" that states "judicial decisions should not be based on any foreign laws, court decisions, or pronouncements of foreign governments unless they are expressly approved by Congress." Tom Feeney, a representative from Florida, stated, "The American people have not consented to being ruled by foreign powers or tribunals." FLAG DISPUTE – U.S. Air Force members in Iraq are furious over a recent order to take down all American flags at Kirkuk air base to avoid offending Iraqis. "The reason we were given is so we would not offend the Iraqi people," stated Sgt. Samuel D. Arbuckle.

"Today in a show of respect and honor especially for those who have fallen, we disobeyed the order and raised our flag, but less than an hour later we were ordered to take our flag down." Sgt. Arbuckle said he would not mind flying the Iraqi flag together with the American flag, "But don't tell us that we can't show the respect for our flag, when so many have died in the name of freedom. The only people I think who would be offended, are the people who kill innocent women and children in the name of religion."

Another soldier responded: "Sir, when we carry the bodies of our fallen men and women to the aircraft for their final flight home, can we still drape the coffins with our flag, or will that still offend the people that we are dying for, so they can be liberated?"

GOD-ORDAINED INSTITUTION? - Joel Belz of World Magazine 3/2004 recently wrote, "The problem isn't so much that we have the wrong views on homosexual marriage; the problem is that, as a society, we have the wrong views about where we get our views."

The Washington Times carried an interesting commentary on the institution of marriage by Assist News, Ted Baehr. "Up until the late 19th century, the state had nothing to do with marriage. People got married in the church. When the state government started to get involved in marriage, they actually put strange and stringent restrictions on it and forgot its initial purpose—which was a union that only existed in the eyes of God. Now, the state is trying to rewrite this God-ordained institution with a plethora of perverse marriages, which will soon open the door to polygamy and more extreme perversity.

"No matter what the state does, however, real marriage is only within the church. Other cultures embrace homosexuality, polygamy, and even child marriages, but marriage, as most people think about it in the United States today, is ordained by Christ.

"As C.S. Lewis pointed out, for these other people it doesn't matter if they're married because true marriage is a covenant ordained by God. Whether the state issues a piece of paper or not, this does not effect the sacrament of marriage—only God does that as an outward and visible sign of an inner and spiritual grace. Without that grace, state-ordained unions are doomed to emptiness and despair, and are a farce."

Rev. Donald Sensing wrote in the March 15, 2004 Wall Street Journal, "The walls of traditional marriage were breached 40 years ago... since the invention of the Pill some 40 years ago. The casual relationships between sex, pregnancy and marriage were severed in a fundamental way. Pair that development with rampant, easy divorce without social stigma, and talk in 2004 of 'saving marriage' is pretty specious. There's little there left to save."

activism was planted last year when were eighth-graders they participating in Project Citizen, a program aimed at enhancing the teaching of civics in Vermont's schools in part by applying what is learned to real-life situations. The 2/ 27/04 Sword of the Lord editors comments: Two things of interest -1) It does show once again the thinking of the Founding Fathers. 



always struggled with facts and accuracy of my observations so that I could understand the truthfulness of the things I observe. But I still don't understand what truth means ultimately and what the Sanskrit maxim, Satyam vijayate (Truth will be victorious), means after all." [Editor's comment: Mother Teresa could have easily coined the phrase "blended worship." Hers was a prayer to whatever god you are most comfortable with. Of course, if one has no absolute sources and compass of truth, how can one know what Truth is? Mr. Batra says, "But I still don't understand what Truth means ultimately..."]

"So when I and my wife, Varsha, a devout Vaishnava whose beliefs and practices come very close to the nonviolent image of Christianity as manifested in thousands of schools, colleges, hospitals and charitable institutions that Jesuits and other Christians have established in India. went to see The Passion of the Christ, the desire was to experience how Mel Gibson saw the truth about Jesus. Before its release, the media had been saturated with the controversy that the movie is an extremely brutal and intolerable depiction of the last days of Jesus; and it is. At one point, my wife gave an agonized cry, Why don't they stop?

"Gibson uses most of the cinematic time in creating a crescendo of violence, piling beating upon beating, flagellation upon flagellation, horror upon horror, culminating in the crucifixion. Yet, the movie never creates that sense of sublime terror, awe and pity that leads to deeper understanding, and

acceptance, and forgiveness, and reconciliation. A great movie like a great work of art beckons you again. Would I go to see *The Passion* again? Nah. Not again. But I would like to see the Fellowship of the Rings: The Return of the King again; Ten Commandments again; Gandhi again. "[Editor comment: Does it not alarm "Bible believing preachers and Christians" that so many would flock to the theatre for a Hollywood actor/ director's Catholic version. This very reaction is a commentary on the shallowness, the lack of discernment, and utter blindness to the truth.]

Mr. Batra continues, "Gibson has been saying that he wanted to present to the American people the truth of the Gospel in all its blood and glory. Of course, there have been many gospels, of which only four have survived in the form of the New Testament. Others have been suppressed or destroyed due to the struggle for control over Jesus legacy. So we would never know the complete truth about Jesus except through our own representations and misrepresentation that suit our needs." [Editor's comment: This is another "every man did that which was right in his own eyes."
