### Sermon of the Month

EPHESIANS 4:31 "LET ALL BITTERNESS, AND WRATH, AND ANGER, AND CLAMOUR, AND EVIL SPEAKING, BE PUT AWAY FROM YOU, WITH ALL MALICE:"

## AGREE TO DISAGREE

A reoccurring theme was characteristic of one ministries business meetings. It was obvious to prevent disagreement or to avoid making decisions the minutes repeatedly year after year stated that item such and such was tabled until a future date or meeting. Some fear disagreement, some are always disagreeable. Christian people do not always find themselves dwelling harmoniously as one. There are among the best of us questions, struggles, and even heated disputes. There may be a right and wrong or even a "doubtful disputation!" Yet even when folk disagree there is a way to move forward. For God's glory to reach the lost and further the gospel ministry, leadership must at times make difficult decisions and press on even amidst opposition. "Stuck in a rut" or "tabling items" that pose potential controversy is not the plan. Yet due to immaturity, ignorance, or iniquity (possibly a combination) wrong decisions and discord can result. "I love to see people fussin' and fightin' and clawin' and bitin'."



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Would you like to be called the meanest preacher in America? For some it is their aim to be contrary. How can Believers dwell together in unity even when some disagree?

Can we agree that the Apostle Paul was God's man, a great preacher, missionary, and spiritual teacher with an unquestionable record? This powerful servant of Christ wrote, "I... could not speak unto you as unto spiritual." Certainly he would desire their maturity. Yet he says they are babes feeding on milk, "not able to bear it, neither yet now are ye able." Even under Paul's leadership and in some good churches today there are those who are not "able" to deal with the "weighty matters," "mature issues," or "hard things." They are easily overwhelmed, confused or "offended." Paul uses strong language in I Corinthians 3:1-4. Note his statement "Ye are vet carnal: for whereas there is envying. and strife, and divisions, are ye not carnal, and walk as men?" In the business of the church can there possibly be envy, strife, and divisions? How controlled are you by your own desires? Immaturity will reflect selfish motivation. Only through His Spirit can we have insight and understanding of God's plans, thoughts, and actions. If it is "I think" and "I feel" it will be "I" centered and not Christ centered! Is it possible for the carnal to be Christ centered?

Ephesians 4:31 says "Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:" Put it all away-ALL! Leave not a residual behind. Listen to Hebrews 12:15: "Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled..." This root will imbed and invade the very fiber and essence of a mortal corrupting all. Be diligent and put it

all away!

I heard it said with my own ears. Not only was the statement unbelievable, it was unscriptural. In an outburst of "bitterness" he said, "I can be bitter if I want to be bitter. Bitterness is not a sin." Bitterness is evidence that the root of faith in Christ is not the source of such outbursts such bitterness. Bitterness is produced by its own root. "Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are. . .?" Yes, the proof of the root is the fruit. A holy life must be rooted in Christ. The old roots of sin and bitterness die with Christ in His death and the new root of faith and life is firmly established by His resurrection power! If the "root of bitterness" is not Christ, then where be the source? The obvious conclusion is sin. Satan and self-not the Saviour. Sin, Satan and self will produce divisiveness and

It is our purpose to lift up the precious blessed name and news of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To HIM who is worthy be honour and glory, amen! Thousands each month read this little "Voice" and many join us in prayer as well as financial support to cry out the message of hope. What a joy to be a part of the sweet rather than the bitter--to share in building rather than tearing down.

Contending for the faith without seeming contentious is difficult at times. However, it was Jesus in the temple with whip in hand. Christ said, "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!" Paul denounced those individuals who turned away. The Apostle John said he would remember the deeds of Diotrephes. Those prating, malicious words meant to hinder and harm the work of God were

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condemned by the apostle. Destructive individuals who bitterly attack God's work position themselves in a perilous place. It is not pleasant to rebuke and warn, but thank God for *The Voice in the Wilderness* and the clear message consistently "Contending for the faith."

I wrote these notes in the margin of my Bible from a sermon preached by a fellow pastor:

- 1. It is better to be divided by TRUTH than united by error.
- 2. It is better to speak the TRUTH that hurts and then heals than a lie that comforts and then kills.
- It is better to hear tough or even rough TRUTH than tender or polished lies.
- 4. It is better to be hated for telling the TRUTH than loved for telling a lie.
- 5. It is better to stand alone for the TRUTH than stand with a crowd in a lie.

My wife and I are now in our tenth year with The Voice in the Wilderness. Believe me, this has been a decade of challenges. Our Lord has indeed been faithful. Without His protection and provision, this ministry would not exist today. It was said to one of our faithful Board members: "Let The Voice in the Wilderness die-Ronnie Williamson can get his own ministry." However, that was not God's will. The Voice in the Wilderness has repeatedly seen our Lord intervene. Those who meant evil were confronted by our God who "meant it unto good." And the more letters they wrote, the more phone calls they made, and the more mis-information they gave the more the Lord blessed The Voice in the Wilderness, Salvation, nourishment, and comfort He brought to pass. And all the while those who set their hand against the Lord's work suffered the more from the cancer of bitterness.

The story is told of a young American soldier who was captured by the enemy during World War II. With a gun and bayonet to his back, the young soldier was forced to march off to prison or possibly death. In the midst of fear, this Christian young man began to whistle a precious

hymn he had sung in church. To his shock the Japanese soldier began to whistle along with his prisoner. At first, the American thought he was hearing an echo. Suddenly, the Japanese came along side and said, "I am a Christian. I learned that hymn in a mission school." The two stopped, not as enemies, but as brothers in Christ. There on the battlefield they fellowshipped in the Prince of Peace. The Spirit of Christ had triumphed over the bitterness of war.

Some will never lay down the weapons of war. But thank God there is sweet Victory in Jesus for those who will only TRUST the Lord. No, we do not always

like the circumstances of life. No, we may not always agree. But in Christ, we can agree to disagree and move forward for God's glory.

Several years ago, Bro. Royce chose two men to manage his personal affairs. Today, Bro. Royce resides in the Lawton Veterans Center. A young Mexican citizen lives in Bro. Royce's house in Dallas and Royce's Power of Attorney handles his finances. The Voice in the Wilderness continues to pay his insurance and tax benefits along with his salary; in addition, he receives his Social Security. VA benefits. and other income as well as financial gifts. The Voice in the Wilderness board is committed to do right for this ministry and founder. Thank the Lord for those friends and partners who have stood with us so faithfully. The Voice in the Wilderness ministry is committed to continue the Biblical Heritage set forth by our founder Dr. J. Royce Thomason. Without being contentious we will contend for the faith. May God help us all.

Now as I continue, what I am about to write may, by some, be easily misunderstood. But at this point, I believe it is important. Please, in no way is this meant to hurt anyone. Nor is the following

offered to impress. The truth of the matter is the Lord has been so gracious and generous to The Voice in the Wilderness, particularly during the past nine years. In terms of missions, the opportunities have been abundant and the results fruitful. This publication has chronicled month after month, year after year, the testimonies of the precious folk we have been privileged to work with around the world. What a blessing! Then, this little printed "Voice" touches thousands every single month. And what a blessing the meetings, preaching, and mission trips have been. On, and on the wonderful story goes!

Yes, there have been some bumps in the road. But here on this earth, we can all expect that. I have even told Bro. Royce that the Lord knew he would get sick on September 10, 2001. The Lord knew about the hospital, rehabilitation center, the loss of driver's license, and the inability to continue his independence and travels. Bro. Royce has talked with me about some of his discouragements and the individuals and decisions he set in place many years ago concerning a time such as this involving power of attorney and necessary decisions for his own personal life and affairs. We have discussed the few individuals who have been hostile to The Voice in the Wilderness. However, I did remind Bro. Royce, that we do have a choice whether to remain discouraged, contentious, and become embittered with life's circumstances. Or we can choose to recognize that our Lord is in control and trust Him regardless the circumstances. The Voice in the Wilderness is thankful for the past blessings, but is moving forward day by day in our Lord's present blessings.

My wife and I prayed for a year before accepting Bro. Royce's invitation. We knew this would be a difficult and perhaps challenging task, but we also knew it was God's call for us. Life indeed has its bumps, but when disagreements and hostilities arise, it is our duty to keep our hearts and eyes on Jesus while *Agreeing to Disagree*. So let me remind the few that have raised their hand in hostile opposition to this work, The Voice in the Wilderness Ministry, that God is in control, this is His work, and by His grace so shall it remain!

The month of September provided numerous opportunities to minister in churches. The Lord has blessed them with talent to minister in music with the Hand Chimes. What a blessing! They have seen salvation decisions, ministered for a week in a Spanish Ministry in Raleigh, NC, as well as, dedicated many hours to preparing, studying, learning, and most importantly speaking with the correct tone and accent the Gospel Plan of Salvation in the Spanish language. You will be hearing more on our newest missionary endeavor as they follow the Lord's leadership.

FROM UGANDA – People here are very eager to listen and please the other person, especially if that other person is a mujungu (muzu-ngu), a white person. They may be looking for a job that the mujungu will give them. They may be looking for money from the mujungu. Sometimes I really hate being a mujungu! But God is good and every so often He



does the work and not the "mujungu factor." God did a work in Ferdinand. Ferdinand is the landlord of two people in our church who have been faithful members for a long time. They were concerned about him and invited him to church. He visited. That next Saturday, I had the privilege of visiting him and sharing the gospel. He claimed to be saved but did not give a clear testimony. He said he would come back to

church again. That next day, he came forward in church to make public his decision to trust Christ. He had asked Christ to save him after I had left the day before. God had done His work in Ferdinand. Since his decision to trust Christ. Ferdinand has brought around ten family members or tenants. Many of those have trusted Christ. He is zealous to share his new faith with those he meets. He is constantly witnessing to and then inviting us to witness to his family or tenants. He is deeply concerned about his father-in-law's village where there is no gospel preaching church. We brought his fatherin-law into town after visiting with him and leading him to the Lord. He enjoyed being at the church and wanted to come everyday. We eventually had to take him home to the village, however, where there is no church. Pray that God will raise up a church in Bwayegamba village. Ferdinand is also very concerned about his home village of Ibanda. This is actually a fair sized town but it does not have a gospel preaching church. Ferdinand wants to build a church there and is talking about using some of his own land for the site. Pray that there will be a church in Ibanda. He has started discipleship and Bible institute and has submitted to every Biblical principle he has been taught. We are excited to see how God will continue to work through Ferdinand and others like him.

FROM VENEZUELA – On Sunday the 28 of August we had an attendance of 95 with over 26 visitors and 19 precious souls prayed to receive Christ as Savior. Many of these people were invited during the last several months and came from three different areas in the city.

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# A Historical Picture Of Thanksgiving



The Pilgrims who sailed to this country aboard the *Mayflower* were originally members of the English Separatist Church (a Puritan sect). They had earlier fled their home in England and sailed to Holland (The Netherlands) to escape religious persecution. There, they enjoyed more religious tolerance, but they eventually became disenchanted with the Dutch way of life, thinking it ungodly. Seeking a better life, the Separatists negotiated with a London stock company to finance a pilgrimage to America. Most of those making the trip aboard the Mayflower were non-Separatists, but were hired to protect the company's interests. Only about one-third of the original colonists were Separatists.

The Pilgrims set ground at Plymouth Rock on December 11, 1620. Their first winter was devastating. At the beginning of the following fall, they had lost 46 of the original 102 who sailed on the *Mayflower*. But the harvest of 1621 was a bountiful one... [The colonists gathered together for a feast and time of thanksgiving to God for His provisions.]

Governor William Bradford sent "four men fowling" after wild ducks and geese. It is not certain that wild turkey was part of their feast. However, it is certain that they had venison. The term "turkey" was used by the Pilgrims to mean any sort of wild fowl.

Another modern staple at almost every Thanksgiving table is pumpkin pie. But it is unlikely that the first feast included that treat. The supply of flour had been long diminished, so there was no bread or pastries of any kind. However, they did eat boiled pumpkin, and they produced a type of fried bread from their corn crop. There was also no milk, cider, potatoes, or butter. There was no domestic cattle for dairy products, and the newly-discovered potato was still considered by many Europeans to be poisonous. But the feast did include fish, berries, watercress, lobster, dried fruit, clams, venison, and plums.

This "thanksgiving" feast was not repeated the following year. But in 1623, during a severe drought, the pilgrims gathered in a prayer service, praying for rain. When a long, steady rain followed the very next day, Governor Bradford proclaimed another day of Thanksgiving, again inviting their Indian friends. It wasn't until June of 1676 that another Day of Thanksgiving was proclaimed.

On June 20, 1676, the governing council of Charlestown, Massachusetts, held a meeting to determine how best to express thanks...

"The Council has thought meet to appoint and set apart the 29th day of this instant June, as a day of Solemn Thanksgiving and praise to God for such his Goodness and Favour, many Particulars of which mercy might be Instanced, but we doubt not those who are sensible of God's Afflictions, have been as diligent to espy him returning to us; and that the Lord may behold us as a People offering Praise and thereby glorifying Him; the Council doth commend it to the Respective Ministers, Elders and people of this Jurisdiction; Solemnly and seriously to keep the same Beseeching that

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being persuaded by the mercies of God we may all, even this whole people offer up our bodies and souls as a living and acceptable Service unto God by Jesus Christ." - 1676 Thanksgiving Proclamation



October of 1777 marked the first time that all 13 colonies joined in a thanksgiving celebration. It also commemorated the patriotic victory over the British at Saratoga. But it was a one-time affair. George Washington proclaimed a National Day of Thanksgiving in 1789.

Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and Whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me to "recommend to the people of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness:" - Given under my hand, at the city of New York, the 3d day of October, A.D. 1789. President George Washington



It was Sarah Josepha magazine Hale, editor, whose efforts eventually led what we recognize as Thanksgiving. Hale wrote many editorials championing her cause in her Boston Ladies' Magazine, and later, Godev's Ladv's Book. Finally, after 40-year campaign

of writing editorials and letters to governors and presidents, Hale's obsession became a reality when, in 1863, President Lincoln proclaimed the *last* Thursday in November as a national day of Thanksgiving.

The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God... No human counsel hath devised nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy. It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American People. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens... - A Presidential Proclamation given by Abraham Lincoln on the Third day of October 1863.

Thanksgiving was proclaimed by every president after Lincoln. The date was changed a couple of times, most recently by Franklin Roosevelt, who set it up one week to the next-to-last Thursday in order to create a longer Christmas shopping season. Public uproar against this decision caused the president to move Thanksgiving back to its original date two years later. And in 1941, Thanksgiving was finally sanctioned by Congress as a legal holiday, as the *fourth* Thursday in November.

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# NEWS BITS FROM HERE AND THERE

### **WATCHING OUR BORDERS**

- According to the Judicial Watch (9/05), President Bush's "temporary guest worker" initiative has "lured" large amounts of illegal immigrants into the United States from Mexico. A survey

was conducted by the Border Patrol to see if this initiative had any result of the mass amounts of people crossing the border. The results are as follows:

- 1. The "temporary guest worker" program was interpreted as an amnesty program by the illegal aliens.
- 2. Early results indicated that the proposal did lure greater numbers of illegal crossings into the US. About 45% crossed illegally due to rumors of an amnesty program.
- 3. About 63% received information from the Mexican government or media supporting the idea of an amnesty program from President Bush.
- **4.** Eighty percent of captured illegal immigrants would seek amnesty if it were offered.
- 5. Over 60% of captured illegal aliens had entered the US previously illegally, some up to six previous times.
- **6**. About 66% wanted to appeal for

family members to also enter into the US.

ACLU SUES, WE PAY! – In 1934, several people erected a monument in the form of a cross made of iron in the Mojave Desert. In 1994, the government declared the area a national preserve. This is when the ACLU stepped in and helped Frank Buono sue for the removal of the monument. The Park Service lost the case and the ACLU invoked the 1976 Federal civil rights law which states that the defendant may have to pay for all legal fees for both parties involved in a case. *World 5/18/05* 



**ACLU HELPS STUDENTS SUE SCHOOL** – In Bakersfield, California, students are suing over the censorship of an article about homosexuality. The ACLU filed the suit on behalf of the students. John Gibson was the principal that edited the article. Gibson said, "It's not about gays and lesbians. It's about student safety." California's education code states that student safety may be a reason for censorship of student articles. *NewsMax July* 2005

# PCTA PROTECTION OF

**ANIMALS?** – A recent billboard in Times Square in New York City contended that the organization known as PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) has a history of killing domesticated animals that were donated to them at their headquarters in Norfolk, VA. David Martosko who is the research director for the Center of Consumer Freedom stated, "PETA raked in nearly \$29 million last year, and much of it was from pet owners who thought their donations actually helped animals. Instead, PETA killed them, while spending millions on programs equating meat eaters with Nazis, scaring young children away from drinking milk, recruiting kids into a radical animal 'rights' lifestyle, and even defending arsonists and other violent extremists." #### **WCC MEETS IN GREECE**

- The World Council of Churches held a conference in Athens, Greece this year entitled "Mission and Evangelism." The leadership of the WCC invited delegates from the Roman Catholic, Pentecostal, Charismatic and Evangelical sects. Dr. Michael Kinnamon, a pastor of


the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), said that "an ecumenical movement that does not involve conversations between people who disagree would not be an ecumenical movement. We must mature and come to understand that there are other faiths than Christianity in God's plan for salvation." Another delegate, Dr. Wonsuk Ma of the Asian Pentecostal Society, said that the pastor of the Yoido Full Gospel Church, Dr. David Yonggi Cho, has the right doctrine in teaching that physical healing is as important as salvation. Cho says that if God cannot heal a person, He is as useful as ancestral spirits. Ms. Viola Raheb, a delegate from the Lutheran church, said, "Violence is because Old Testament passages legitimize violence. We must turn away from the Old Testament with such passages as the fall of Jericho, and stay instead in the New Testament with its emphasis on love." She went on to say that "there is no one in our time who ever preaches from such passages." This theologian ignores what the writer of Hebrews said when he wrote, "By faith the wall of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days." # A Song Outlasts Them All

On October 21, 1808 Boston, Massachusetts welcomed a new baby boy. As the boy grew, he attended the first public school in America, Boston Latin School. He proved himself to be a fine scholar, and even became quite efficient in many foreign languages. This knowledge equipped him as a first-rate translator which provided a source of income during his Harvard College days. After graduating with honors he worked in journalism. This initial career became short-lived when he followed God's call to Andover Theological Seminary to prepare for the ministry. As he pursued the ministry call, his talents of writing and languages were not forgotten. While studying in Germany in 1832, he was inspired by school children to write a poem. Each morning, the German school children began the day by singing a hymn. After compiling the poem, he adapted the tune of England's "God Save the Queen" and finished a hymn for the American classroom.

On his return to America, he became a professor of modern languages and a Baptist pastor in Waterville, Maine. By 1895, he had served as an editor, pastor, professor, translator, and secretary of the Baptist Missionary Union. Nevertheless, this vast resume is not what he is known for by today's Americans. As

described in verse by his classmate at Harvard, Oliver Wendell Holmes, he is remembered by that one hymn poem inspired by the school children.


> Full many a poet's labored lines A century's creeping waves shall hide-The verse of people's love enshrines Stands like a rock that breasts the tide.

Time wrecks the proudest piles we raise, The towers, the dome, the temples fall. The fortress crumbles and decays-When breath of song outlasts them all.

The American classroom hymn was first performed on July 4, 1832 at Boston's Park Street Church. Boston again recognized this important contribution as they honored its author in 1895. But the hymn was sung most reverently at its authors funeral. On November 16, 1895, Samuel Francis Smith died. "AMERICA" was sung in his honor, and still today, school children across America honor their country each morning by singing Smith's poetic words. May we never forget that we live in a "Sweet land of liberty" where God Almighty is the "Author of liberty." -RWL


My country 'tis of thee,

### You'll Never Look At A Cup Of Coffee The Same Way Again...

A young woman went to her mother and told her about her life, how things were so hard for her. She didn't know how she was going to make it, and she wanted to give up. She was tired of fighting and struggling. It seemed as soon as one of her problems was solved, a new one popped up.

Her mother took her into her kitchen, where she filled three pots with water. if they are spies. This reaction should only last for a short time and is purely political but other side affects have taken place. I have been verbally assaulted several times while going door to door. Several people have said that I am an imperialist from the US or work for the CIA. Many church groups have announced the need to make sure that their churches have been registered as nonprofit organizations and have all financial records in order in case of a necessary investigation by the government. If the Venezuelan government does start to pressure the churches it could mean persecution to some. **DOES PRAYER HELP? - The** 

Midnight Call October 2005 reported the following on prayer and sickness. "The study of more than 700 heart patients, one of the most ambitious attempts to test the medicinal power of prayer, showed that those who had people praying for them from a distance, and without their knowledge, were no less likely to suffer a major complication, end up back in the hospital. For the latest study, Mitchell Krucoff, a cardiologist at Duke University Medical Center in Durham, NC, and his colleagues designed a complicated experiment

involving 748 patients who underwent treatment at nine hospitals around the country for heart problems between 1999 and 2002. The researchers enlisted 12 congregations of various Christian denominations, Jews, Muslims and Buddhists around the world to pray for some of the patients, giving them names, ages and descriptions of the illness. The first quarter had people praying for them. The second quarter received a nontraditional treatment known as music, imagery and touch (MIT) therapy, which involved breathing techniques, soothing music, touch and other ways to relieve stress, such as imagining calming images. The third group received both prayer and the therapy, and the fourth received nothing. Overall, there was no difference among the four groups, the researchers are reporting in the Lancet medical journal."

### **SCREAMS AND SQUEALS AT 30 THOUSAND FEET**

No, it wasn't the panic of horrified passengers, even though the gentleman on the aisle seat was about to have a screaming fit of his own. My wife and I were leaving Dallas en route to Atlanta after visiting with the founder of The Voice in the Wilderness, Dr. J. Royce Thomason. This screaming, squealing, kicking routine is no way to fly. It may be a different journey we prefer, but buckle your seat belt of truth, relax your feet in the slippers of peace, and recline back in the arms of Jesus. He is the shelter in the time of storm.
