

Dear Friends:




May is a month set aside to honour those who uniquely give themselves to serving others. In the March/April


Sermon of the Month

"For the love of money is the root of all evil. . ." I Tim. 6:10

The Love of Money

Sadly the Clintons are far from being the only crooked politicians in high places. Their dirty investments, foreign connections, and illegal campaign funds unquestionably leave an odious trail of power and greed. And now Tom Delay's alleged campaign money laundering demonstrates the treachery of the money trap. Several members of Congress are linked to Abramoff and Scanlon in the lobbying scandal. Yes, and note the connection with Indian tribe casinos. Even the Ethics Committee has been entangled by money dealing with such as staff allocations to the omission of their "watchdog" duties. Republicans and Democrats alike are guilty of money crimes, special interest, and perk payoffs. This practice of bribery and "love of money" grips this country with a death hold.

Human Events January 23, 2006, stated "over the past three decades, the NEA has carpet-bombed the political landscape with money." In just the one-year period from September 2004



through August 2005, the NEA spent \$25 million on political activities and lobbying, and another \$65.5 million on contributions, gifts, and grants. The NEA's political support goes almost exclusively to the Democratic Party. The money corruption runs deep. For years, unions in this country have comprised the top political contributors. The dollar sign has blinded any common sense and good judgment. Just check the record.


Robert Spencer, in his article "Preserving the Constitution While Saving Civilization" wrote, "On January 5, 2005, a drug runner named Noel Exinia, who was engaged in transporting more than 500 pounds of cocaine from Mexico to New York City, revealed in a telephone conversation that he was interested in other kinds of cargo as well. He spoke about 20 Iragis who would pay \$8,000 to get into the United States." These were extremely dangerous people and the call was recorded under the Patriot Act. But again, the point of money and its death grip will lead people to horrendous acts. For "the love of money" there are those who will sell out themselves, their families, and their country.

From "faith healers" to televangelists, sordid stories have played out in the media about big money and corruption so inherent to vulnerable "mega-ministries." The Jim Bakers and PTL type scandals have been numerous. Even large "ministries," such as Pat Roberson's CBN and 700 Club, seemingly escape debilitating scrutiny, yet are entangled with Big Money investments, Hollywood movie connections and at the least very questionable financial associations. Yet Christians will continue to throw money at religious organizations that take in multiplied millions per year even per month while withholding with skepticism, from solid, Bible-based local church ministries. Ready is the purse and wallet to rally for a lavish, full color, Madison Avenue, Hollywood style "Christian production" while the humble grassroots, local church mission truly living by faith is often token tipped as a second class citizen. Explain that attitude.

In March 2006, churches and Christians in Asheville, NC, rallied in support of local businesses that uphold biblical family values. The spark for the event was a local business that dismissed two females doing freelance work for the company. The lesbian couple announced their wedding and the Wolf Laurel company dispensed with their services. Wolf Laurel stated that the lifestyle of the two lesbians was contradictory to the family values of the business. Asheville, NC, has a very militant homosexual community that came out vocally against Wolf Laurel. However, North Carolina law supports Wolf Laurel's right to dismiss the two Sodomites. With that said, godly people in the area saw a need to publicly support business owners willing to stand for decency and Bible values. A rally, with well over 1,000 supporters, was held in downtown Asheville in open support of businesses with commitment to biblical family values. Many local companies, churches, and organizations signed on. One such group was a local, church-based disaster relief ministry. However,

NEWS BITS FROM HERE AND THERE

BEWARE OF LIBERAL **MEDIA-** Would the liberal media lie? A case in point. Sometime during the Clinton presidency, I was in India preaching and visiting churches and pastors. Of note, President Bill Clinton was in India at the same time. He was accompanied by this huge expensive entourage. I seem to recall the Indian press talking about Mr. Clinton's peculiar arrangements for his stay in India. Apparently, he brought his own bed linens and food for the trip. CARTER CORRECTS BUSH?- At the announcement of his son's senatorial campaign and at the funeral of Coretta Scott King, former President Jimmy Carter criticized the Bush administration for the wiretapping and surveillance without warrants in the name of national security. "Under the Bush administration, there's been a disgraceful and illegal decision-we're not going to the let the judges or the Congress or anyone else know that we're spying on the American people. And no one knows how many innocent Americans have had their privacy violated under this secret act." Mr. Carter has forgotten his administration's tapping of two men suspected of spying for Vietnam in 1977. Then Attorney General Griffin Bell defended the wiretapping in the U. S. Court of Appeals for the 4th Circuit (which ruled in favor of the wiretapping). The court's opinion said that the President had the "inherent authority" to wiretap and is not obligated to obtain warrants when it is "conducted 'primarily' for foreign intelligence reasons." Now Mr. Carter is saying that it was "ridiculous" for Attorney General Gonzales to justify the current wiretapping with Article II of the Constitution. The Washington Times 2/20/06

U. S. REPORT CARD TO

THE WORLD- NewsMax.com (3/8/06) reports that on 12 key General Assembly votes in the United Nations, only four countries were on the United States side most of the time. You would think that countries such as France, Germany, Italy, Japan, and South Korea would side with the U. S., but they voted with the U.S. only 8% of the time. By the way, the four countries that did side with the U. S. were Israel, Palau, Micronesia, and the Marshall Islands. **ABSTINENCE ATTACKED**

On January 26, the Bush administration released their criteria for its Community-Based Abstinence Education Program. This program will promote the practice of abstinence until marriage. The Sexuality Information and Education Council of the United States is criticizing this program on two points: trying to "promote marriage" and teaching "that sexual desires are natural and controllable and that individuals are capable of making choices to abstain from sexual activity." Dr. Wade Horn, head of the Administration for Children and Families, said, "Today's youth are bombarded by implicit and explicit messages that promote sexual activity before and outside of marriage. Unfortunately, teens receive less information about the physical and emotional benefits that they may find by having one lifelong sexual partner within marriage." Representative Henry Waxman (D. -Calif.) wrote to Michael Leavitt (Secretary of Health and Human Services): "Under the new guidelines, funding for abstinence education will be awarded based on ideology, not the effectiveness of programs in reducing teen sexual activity, teen pregnancy, and teen sexually [transmitted] disease rates." ALIEN BABY BOOM- 23% of births in the U. S. is to immigrant mothers. 42% of those children are born to mothers who are in the United States illegally. "We are heading, if you will, into uncharted territory. In the past, immigration was significantly reduced when it reached a similar level, but that's not happening today," said Steve Camarota, director of research at the Center for Immigration Studies. Since the children born in the United States are automatically citizens and can stay on a permanent basis, it will be harder to deport the illegal aliens. *Midnight Call 3/06* {In March 2006 Iowa recorded an excessive outbreak of Mumps. Watch the correlation between illegal immigrants and disease in the U.S.A.}

EUROPEAN HUMAN **RIGHTS**- Due to the terrorist attacks in London last year, the European Parliament wants EU citizens to agree to give up some of their civil liberties for the sake of safety. Charles Clarke, UK home secretary, said, "European Union states may have to accept an erosion of some civil liberties if their citizens are to be protected from organized crime and terrorism." Mr. Clarke claims that the imbalance of privacy and protection favor the terrorists right now. UK liberal MEP Graham Watson said, "We do not agree ... that the human rights of the victims are more important than the human rights of the terrorists. Human Rights are indivisible. 

What About CREMATION?

Confusion and error continue to grow in this country with an obvious "Money Connection." Not only are the crematories profiting, but cremation, itself, is being marketed as a much less expensive means. The following is a reprint of a needed article on this subject.

More than 300 corpses stacked in sheds or rotting in the woods were found. This certainly was a nightmare for the many families involved. The criminal investigation in Lafayette, Georgia, of this bizarre story surrounded a crematory. Originally, the excuse for the decomposing bodies was a broken incinerator. However, that was not true and photos of the bodies were found on the office computer of Ray Brent Marsh, the crematory's operators.

Think about this. **Hundreds** of bodies to be **cremated** – this service was paid for by the deceased family. **How many people in America are now using cremation**?

A graduating class in 2000 was surveyed and among the questions these young people were asked was: "What is your greatest fear?" Their reply: "Our greatest fear is the death of a loved one." The answer was not what caught my attention; rather it was the story behind the survey. Two teens were featured that had already experienced this dreaded event. One family was interviewed on an Oregon beach where they had recently scattered the cremated ashes of their loved one. This member of the Class of 2000 shared her sorrow over the death of her younger sister. Now, with risk of seeming callous what stood out to me was the fact this family had chosen cremation. I am amazed how often this subject comes up in conversation. Christians are exploring cremation as an option. I do believe we have some clear examples and guidelines concerning burial and the treatment of the body after death. I appreciate Dr. Gregory D. Mutsch for permitting me to use the following article.

Cremation is the irreversible process of reducing human remains to bone fragments through extreme heat and evaporation. To begin the cremation process, the human remains and the cremation container are placed in the cremation chamber. Open flames raise the temperature to 1,600-2,000 degrees Fahrenheit for approximately two to three hours. To reposition the

human remains or to remove the cremated remains from the cremation chamber, a broad hoe-like instrument is used. Every effort is made by the operator to completely remove every particle from the chamber floor. However, tiny particles may remain in the cremation chamber and become co-mingled with particles of another cremation. Throughout church history, ground burial has been the tradition, but in recent years, the popularity of cremation accounts for 50% of final dispositions.

Fire Frequently Represents Judgment in the Bible

God destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah with fire (Gen. 19:24). He used fire to judge Nadab and Abihu for their inappropriate sacrifices (Lev. 10:1-2) and to punish those who were insubordinate to the spiritual leadership of Moses (Num. 16:1-32, 35). When Achan disobeyed God's prohibition of claiming possessions from the cities destroyed during the conquest, he was stoned and burned with fire (John 7:15, 25).

God's final judgment of this world will be by fire. "Wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved and the elements shall melt with fervent heat" (2 Pet. 3:12). God destroyed the whole world once with a flood, but His second and final judgment will be by cremation. The final abode for those who reject Christ will be in a place of fire. "And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire" (Rev. 20:15). It is inconsistent for Bible believers who have been saved from the judgment of fire to use this method to dispose of their bodies at death.

The New Testament Pattern Is Ground Burial

The supreme example for a Bible believer is Jesus Christ in both His life and death. "…leaving us an example, that we should follow his steps" (1 Pet. 2:21). Jesus was buried because this was consistent with Old Testament Jewish history and because burial fulfilled the plan of God (Isa. 53:9). Jesus Christ is the author of the New Testament in which cremation is not once practiced. Ground burial in contrast was employed for John the Baptist (Mark 6:29), the Rich Man (Luke 16:22), Lazarus

(John 11:17-19), Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:6-10).

Ground Burial Honors the Temple of the Body

Man is a three-part being: body, soul and spirit. All 4. three parts belong to God since man is created in God's image (Gen. 1:27). When a man becomes a Christian, God's spirit takes up residence within him, and from that time, his body is God's temple. "Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Cor. 6:19-20). Although God's Word does not give us a declaration regarding cremation, it does teach us principles by which we can reach a Biblical conclusion.

Since we do not own our bodies, we do not have the right to do as we choose. To adopt a practice which has pagan roots is to dishonor the temple of God.

Although cremation is popular in our modern culture, nowhere is it practiced by believers in the Old Testatment, New Testament, or in the early history of the church. Romans 15:4 declares, "For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning." The lesson clearly taught is that God's people from Moses to Jesus Christ chose not to be cremated.

Now, take a few minutes to read what the Apostle Paul says in Romans 6:1-5. Note that those of you who "…were baptized into His death? Therefore we are buried (not cremated) with Him by baptism into death; that like as Christ…." Profound teaching and illustration we believers are given here by the Holy Spirit. Where does the idea of cremation come from? On the other hand, where do we get our teaching about the believers' death, burial, and resurrection unto eternal life?

Cremation is becoming very popular in this country and many believers and pastors have questions as to its origin and appropriateness for the Christian. For the sake of time, let me just make the following comments and leave it at that:

- 1. Cremation irrefutably, without a doubt, has its origin and roots in paganism.
- 2. From the Old Testament to the early church, burial was the practice, not cremation.
- 3. With the bones of Joseph (Ex. 13:19) to the borrowed

tomb of Joseph of Arimathaea, great care, respect, and expense is taken for the body. Read about that alabaster box of ointment and the fact no rebuke came from Jesus (Mark 14: 3-9).

- . As far as the value of the body itself, well that's not the point. It's not necessarily the value of a thing, but the value is in doing what is right. A rich man's tithe probably exceeds in value the widow's mite but...Cain's fruit of the ground versus Abel's firstling – which was more valuable? I do know which was right. What's valuable about Joseph's old bones? But Moses knew what was right. What is so valuable about this old body? Well, the Bible has a lot to say about the temple, raising of the dead, corruptible putting on incorruption and the bodily resurrection and on and on!
- 5. When it comes to accidentally or intentionally burning the body, God is sovereign and omnipotent over atoms, molecules, ashes and dust. He will have no problem with bodies on the resurrection day.
- 6. 1 Cor. 13:3 Paul is talking about martyrdom not cremation. In 1 Samuel 31:12 they burnt the bodies of Saul and his sons. Of course you know how Saul died. I will not describe for you what these mutilated, bird-picked decaying bodies were like. This was not cremation. This was preparation for burial of incredibly emaciated bodies. Note the burial in 1 Samuel 31:13. Lastly, 1 Kings 16:15-19 is not cremation but "For his sins which he sinned in doing evil in the sight of the Lord."

In one service, I finished preaching, gave the invitation, and moved to the door to shake hands as folks began to file out of the auditorium. This church had been without a pastor for sometime, and on several occasions I was asked to fill the pulpit. A man and wife came by to express appreciation for my help and request prayer. This lady's mother had just passed away and to my shock the body was cremated.

Here is another experience I've had with cremation. A lady in our church and her husband decided to take a three-month trip to Alaska. Sue and Tom (names changed) owned a beautiful home and asked my family and I to do house sitting for them, and we did. Tom's brother traveled with them to Alaska, but sad to say, Tom's brother died while in Alaska. His body was cremated and sent to me via USPS. Needless to say, Tom's brother sat on the shelf until they returned home! - *RLW*

IS THE THIRD TEMPLE READY?- In Jerusalem at the Temple Institute, skilled artisans finished a three-year project of putting the Techelet robe together. This robe made of blue, purple, and scarlet wool with 72 golden bells and pomegranates, is to be worn by the high priest. Other high priestly items such as the ephod and breastplate are already finished. It is the hopes of the researchers that the high priest of the Third Temple will use this robe. *Zion's Fire Jan/Feb 06*

SAINTLY DOLLS- The Berean Call (2/28/06) informed us of the use of dolls to comfort children. Mary Englund moved her 5-yearold child into a basement room and put a statue of Jesus in bed with him because he was afraid. "I put it under the blanket and told him, 'Jesus wouldn't want you to be afraid.' He was fine with it . . . When I left the room, I thought, 'I wonder if there is a Jesus doll'." Mrs. Englund then created "My Loving Jesus Doll." She is not the only one in this business. Jim Keding is also trying to sell dolls to Catholic stores nationwide. Teri O'Toole, founder

of Soft Saints, began making dolls of Jesus, the Virgin Mary, Joan of Arc, Pope John Paul II, St. Francis, and Mother Teresa, and 24 other historical characters in 2000. The price of these religious dolls ranges from \$16.95 to \$98 each. {Editor: Have we forgotten that Exodus 20:4 commands us not to "make unto thee any graven image that is in heaven above or that is in the earth beneath?"}

RELIGIOUS UNITY?- The

World Council of Churches recently had a meeting in Porto Alegre, Brazil. This ten-day meeting was attended by 800 delegates and 3,000 church leaders, scholars, advisors, and activists. One of the goals announced at this meeting was for "a greater measure of unity with those outside the WCC fold." According to Hilarion Alfeyev, the leading Orthodox bishop, the gap between traditional Christianity and liberal Christianity "is only growing day by day." The US delegation also read a two-page letter that "denounced the US government, apologized for all its supposed wrongs, and claimed that the United States is pushing the world toward environmental catastrophe." BIBLE AND SOCIAL SCIENCE- "A biblical worldview often reveals the limitations of conventional approaches and pushes us to ask the right questions, so

that the data we obtain will not leave us still ignorant." (Marvin Olasky Human Events 3/6/06) In February, President Bush signed into law a welfare reform bill that funds marriage education. This law is a reaction to the former welfare reform bills based on Wisconsin's reforms. In one of the training rooms in Wisconsin, there are quotes on the wall such as, "A family doesn't need a man to be whole," and "Stop waiting for Prince Charming, his horse broke down." A report published in 2003 by the Manhattan Institute said, "we must find a way to get fathers involved."

deem Shiites to be idolaters. They do not approve of their veneration of human beings, their devotion to shrines, or their mysticism. Only 15% of Muslims are Shiites, but they are predominately in Iran, Syria, and Iraq. Al-Zarqawi, the al-Qaeda leader of Iraq, said that the Shiites are "a greater danger and . . . more destructive to the nation" than the United States. "Targeting and hitting them will provoke them to show the Sunnis their rabies."



DARWIN SUNDAY- All over our nation on February 12, people were going to church to worship. Some may not have known it, but their service would be centered on "Evolution Sunday." This day was the brainchild of Professor Michael Zimmerman of the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. Mr. Zimmerman started what he called "The Clergy Letter Project." This is a statement of more than 10,000 clergy who are in support of evolution. "I wanted to let the public know that numerous clergy from most denominations have tremendous respect for evolutionary theory and have embraced it as a core component of human knowledge, full harmonious with religious faith." *Answers in Genesis and Michael Zimmerman University of Wisconsin Oshkosh*

SUPPORTING FAITH- The

Washington Times (3/20) reports on a recent Gallup research that frequent churchgoers mostly support the war in Iraq. Of those that don't go to church, 26% Republicans and 81% of Democrats opposed the war. There is a discrepancy among the different religions. Protestants support the war by 55%, where as Catholics opposed it by 52%. Of those who do not go to church, 62% oppose the war. The Southern Baptist Convention said in 2003, "Our choice is to pay less now and deal with this problem or we can pay a lot more later." The Orthodox Union (Jewish) said that they supported President Bush 100%. 📞

shortly after the rally, it appears pressure was brought to bear and the relief organization, in a television interview, expressed the removal of its name as a supporter of the rally. The ministries director stated that it was their policy not to get involved in political issues. The director said it could alienate people and jeopardize the ministries tax-exempt status.

Now could there be a money connection here? If you take a stand against Sodomy, and yes "alienate" business people and contributors who are sodomites, would that not obviously hurt financially? After all, it is a known fact that there is big money in the homosexual community of Asheville, N. C. But since when, for a Christian, is Sodomy a political issue? Sin is a biblical issue.
