

AN INTERVIEW WITH BRO. ROYCE THOMASON

President Emeritus and Founder of The Voice in the Wilderness, Inc.

7he Voice IN THE Wilderness EDITORIAL SCHOOLDAYS GOLDENRULE DAYS

For many young people across America, it will soon be "Back to School." That means different things to a lot of families. Even Christian families approach the education of their children in various ways. Some place their young folk in public or government-run institutions, while others utilize some form of private education. Then there are many Christian parents that home school their children or enroll them in a church-run school or Christian school. The freedom to make that choice is still afforded parents in this country. However, does the scripture permit that liberty? Psalm 1:1 says, "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful."

Even before our first child was born my wife and I committed to never place our children in public schools. The right Christian school or home school would not only be our choice but our conviction as well. Now maybe I was a bit brash, but I made the statement I would go to jail before I allowed my child to attend a public government-run school. With two of our children in heaven, Terry and I had the responsibility to only educate our daughter, Rebekah. She attended a Christian school for kindergarten, first and second grade. Then we home schooled for ten years. We could not begin to tell you how special this experience was. Oh the richness of this unique relationship between parent and child. Never would I trade the sweet and cherished memories of home schooling.

Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly. Is this difficult to understand? Need we spend a great deal of time expounding or expanding such clear and concise language? There is multiplied happiness for the man, the individual that lives out the life God intended for that person. He follows God's counsel not the world's way of doing things. He obeys God's commands and lives according to God's Word. Oh, the "blessednesses" that spring abundantly from such a life. The counsel of the ungodly will rob you of all the "blessednesses" the Lord has and desires for you. Yes, this is plainly set forth. It's the course of the world or the course of HIS WORD. Please, for your sake and the sake of your family, "walk not in the counsel of the ungodly."

...nor standeth in the way of sinners... Are you blood-washed by the Lamb of God and quickened to life by his precious Holy Spirit? Then stand not in the way of sinners. Certainly you do not ask, "What is the way of sinners?" To stand in the way of sinners is so obvious. Just look around. If you stand in the way of sinners you will not be standing with the Savior and His saints. The child of God enjoys much blessedness because he now stands in the midst of all God's blessing.

...nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful...To mock, to scoff at God, eternity, heaven, hell, sin and all that is right is the seat of the scornful. The seat of the scornful is the threshold of hell.

Now, do you see the progression? **Walk, stand, and sit.** We will discuss this later. Suffice it to say the blessed man, the man that is truly a happy man, is one that is holy. The holy life is happiness. The blessed reject the counsel of the ungodly, the company of sinners and utter corruptions of the scornful. The blessed embrace in all of life, God and His Word.

Did you know that the first so called public and private schools in America were founded firmly on the Bible? Traditional education in this country was:

- 1. God centered.
- 2. Biblically based.
- 3. Christ honoring.

Education in this country once taught the good and godly. Then in the early 1900s a so called progressive philosophy was introduced which denied God and rejected good. I came through the "progressive" system, and I know what is what.

However, my wife and I taught from a traditional philosophy where God, His Word, character, discipline,

absolutes, authority and solid academics are bed-rock. The difference in the two philosophies is as clear as Psalm 1:1. "School days, school days, good old golden rule days." What ever happened? It's so simple – we violated Psalm 1:1.

Christian parent – may I challenge you to take God's Word and with a submissive heart study and pray before His sweet Holy Spirit for God's will in the education of your children? What is HIS WILL in this matter? Money, time, lifestyle, parental capabilities are all factors, but have you submitted your will to Him seeking His way in these most critical years of your child's life?

It was my high school English teacher that said, "God is a crutch, created in the minds of men to lean upon." That was 1971.

Oh, but my public school is not like that, Bro. Ronnie. My public school has Christian teachers.

If there were no other verses in all of God's Word that spoke to this point with the exception of Psalm 1:1, this would settle it for me.

"Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful." By the way, read the rest of the chapter. Are your children – are you walking in the counsel of the ungodly? Are your children – are you standing in the way of sinners? Are your children – are you sitting in the seat of the scornful? Walketh, standeth, sitteth – there's a lot of that in education and school. Is your walking, standing, and sitting according to HIS WORD?

NEWS BITS FROM HERE AND THERE

CENSORSHIP - Back in April the Maryland Senate barred a pastor from offering prayer when he refused to drop the reference to Jesus Christ. Two Jewish senators threatened to boycott the assembly if the prayer was allowed, so the senate head barred Pastor David Hughes from praying. Maryland was one of the first states in the U.S. to grant religious liberty, but now it is descending back into the Dark Ages of religious censorship. *Christian News*, 4/03



CHINA'S SECRET AGENDA

- While the Bush administration encourages more trade with China and manufacturing is shifted from the U.S. to China, the communist government of China continues its persecution of Christians. The Voice of the Martyrs say they have obtained a top-secret document that proves the Chinese government has an ongoing, systematic campaign to expose and destroy unregistered protestant churches in the Hebei Province. The directive is a work plan order from the Public Security Bureau. It instructs the bureaus to terminate "illegal Protestant activities." Dated August 20, 2002, the directive details the effort to "establish a secret force" to infiltrate unregistered church groups to gather in-depth intelligence against Protestant church activities, and to "set up full files; recognize influential people and illegal meeting places." Bureaus are instructed to

confiscate "illegal publicizing" materials used for evangelism and are told that "stubborn members," believers refusing to "voluntarily obey regulations of the government," should be "severely punished." *Voice* of the Martyrs. 4/03..... Fines are also to be used in China to force women to terminate pregnancies in its one-child policy. One province has raised fines for second children without permission from twice combined incomes to eight times combined incomes.



TERRORIST NATIONS **MEMBERS OF UN** – The United Nations recently put communist Cuba on the Human Rights Committee-further proof that UN ideals are just a myth. Freedom Alliance's director Fred Gedrich feels the UN is the farthest thing there is from a peace-loving organization. He points out that the United Nations Charter says membership is open only to "peace-loving' nations and at least 47 UN members are the worst dictatorships in the world. "Seven are identified as 'terrorist states' by the U.S. government," Gedrich says. "We shouldn't put that institution on a moral plane with the United States, certainly-under and no circumstances-should we ever defer to that body to decide what is in our national security interest." EXPERT LAMENTS LOWLY STATUS OF CURSIVE IN **EDUCATION** – An expert of penmanship fears that young students today too often replace their pencils with keyboards and cell-phone touch pads. "Students particularly in the public school sector, think of handwriting as an old fuddy-duddy kind of thing that is old-fashioned and, in their eyes, isn't necessary anymore because they've got the computer - and to them, the computer pretty much does all," says Michael Sull, former president of the International Association of Master Penmen. He goes on to say that many school students and public education systems now believe learning how to write in cursive is unnecessary, but handwriting will stand the test of time as it always has. Since your editor once served in the Christian Education ministry, I am aware of home schools as well as Christian Schools that are using curriculum that teaches cursive writing as early as four-year-old kindergarten. The A Beka Book curriculum used in many schools and home schools conducted research several years ago on cursive writing and began incorporating this style of writing into their program from the onset of training. The art of communicating through handwriting should never be lost.

REFORM JUDAISM SANCTIONED SAME-SEX MARRIAGES IN 2000 - Now

Conservative Leaders Have Agreed to Reconsider - In Newsweek 3/03 issue it was reported that though Reform Judaism sanctioned samesex marriages in 2000, the Conservative movement has not. But that could be changing. Conservative leaders have agreed to revisit a 1992 decision reaffirming their ban on same-sex weddings and the ordination of openly gay or lesbian clergy. The pressure to reconsider the issue has come largely from Conservative rabbinical students, 88 of whom wrote to the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards insisting that the Torah "can offer us a Jewish way of celebrating...loving same-sex relationships." No decision is expected from the committee, a 25rabbi council, until 2004.

PRO-FAMILY LEADER SAY 'GAY THEOLOGY' IS D A N G E R O U S , U N D E R M I N E S SCRIPTURAL AUTHORITY

- An ordained United Methodist minister is out with a new book that claims Jesus Christ was a homosexual. The book by Chicago Theological Seminary professor Theodore Jennings is called The Man Jesus Loved: Homoerotic narratives from the New Testament. In it. Jennings argues that Christ had a homosexual relationship with John - who the Bible refers to as "the disciple Jesus loved" - and says the Bible affirms homosexual relationships and celebrates the erotic. Bob Knight of the Culture and Family Institute says Jennings is another in a long line of "gay theologians" who are rewriting the

Bible. He adds that he wishes a publisher would not even consider the book worthy of publishing, and that Pilgrim Press ought to be ashamed of itself for publishing it. "For a guy like this to have the credentials he does says a lot about where the Methodist Church has gone," Knight says. "It's time for Bible-believing Methodists to set down some standards and ensure that people who are speaking in the name of the Methodist Church really do understand the authority of scripture – and can convey it accurately."

There is a movement by some members of United Methodist Churches in Mississippi to renew and restore evangelical tenets within their denomination. Jeff Switzer, pastor of a United Methodist Church in Philadelphia, Mississippi, launched Mississippi Fellowship of United Methodist Evangelicals. The new fellowship has a two-fold purpose to contend for the historical, classical Christian faith and to proclaim the apostolic faith. Switzer believes the denomination is headed in directions that would be very disturbing to John Wesley, founder of Methodism. He sees the church abandoning traditional Scriptural principles in order to look more like other world religions. Switzer says the fellowship must express opposition to bureaucratic Methodist leaders who prefer tolerance over Biblical truth and universalism over conversion. Agape Press via Christian News 5/ 03

SUPREME COURT UPHOLDS INTERNET PORNOGRAPHY FILTERS FOR LIBRARIES – In a 6-3

decision, the United States Supreme Court upheld the constitutionality of a federal statue requiring internet pornography filters in all public libraries that receive any federal funds. The majority decision included two justices who cited as a part of their reasoning the fact that adults could request to have the filtering removed for their use of the internet. 

The court found that a reasonable person familiar with the plaque's history would regard the decision to leave it in place as religiously neutral, rather than evangelical in nature. The court said while the message of the Ten Commandments is "inherently religious," there can also be secular purposes for posting them and historical reasons for leaving them in place. The plaque in question is 50 inches tall, and was attached to the Chester county Courthouse in West Chester in 1920. The courthouse was built in 1846 and is on the National Register of Historic Places. Members of the Freethought Society of Greater Philadelphia, an atheist group, filed suit against the county, contending the plaque violated the constitutional separation of church and state.
