NEWS BITS FROM HERE AND THERE

IT'S OFFICIAL - "LEFT **WING?"** - George Washington University in Washington, D.C., held its annual commencement exercises May 16 on the Ellipse behind the White House. After all the degrees had been awarded, several students prematurely shouted and threw their mortarboards into the air. But the, according to graduate student Timothy Shaw and his family, university president Stephen Joel Trachtenberg said, "For those of you who still have your caps, you may move your tassels from right to left, just like I hope you have moved your politics in the time you've been here." There seemed to be no levity in his tone or demeanor, Shaw told Human Events 5/24/04. "Those were basically the last words spoken at the graduation."

WORLDVIEW - WHO DO YOU LISTEN TO? - You would have thought that the discovery of an actual weapon of mass destruction in Iraq would be big news, especially since it was aimed at American soldiers. The Iraqi Survey Group, which is tasked with searching for Saddam's WMD, confirmed an artillery round containing weaponized sarin nerve gas was detonated in an improvised explosive device (IED) aimed at U.S. troops recently. Thankfully, the IED didn't kill anyone, and the sarin components dispersed without causing real harm because the 155-mm shell had not

been used as an artillery round, as intended. Instead, the device detonated in an IED, and most of the three to four liters of sarin were not activated. [Most newspapers carried the story buried deep within its paper, if at all. We all need to think beyond what the media puts before us. WHO CANNOT BE A BLOOD DONOR? – Sometime ago, the editor of *World* Magazine went to the Red Cross where he regularly gives blood. But this time seemed to be a little different. It seems Mr. Belz had time to notice a few signs and brochures during his visit and relates the following story:

"Walk into the lobby, and you're handed the book, a bulky three-ring binder you're asked to read through to see if you qualify. The book gives you half a dozen opportunities to disqualify yourself before anyone sees the first drop of your blood.... Next stop... is 'the clipboard' in the next room. Here, you're asked to check off more than 50 separate fine print questions... Here's the point that leaped off "the clipboard" with startling clarity: Under the heading, 'Who can not be a blood donor," was disqualification No. 7: 'If you are a male, [and have] had sex even once with another male since 1977....' In other words, no honest practicing male homosexual can be part of the blood-donor system in our culture. Granted, 'the clipboard' also makes it clear that others may not give blood.... But not a single one of those conditions involves a conscious lifestyle choice like that exercised by homosexuals." Or is it that they are saying that the homosexual lifestyle is an unnatural and unhealthy way to live? Of course, God says it is SIN.]

RELIGIOUS NEWS AND COMMENTS

CHURCHES SHIFT TO **CONTEMPORARY** – According to a newly released study, more churches incorporate non-traditional music, diverse styles of worship, and modern technologies into their worship experience. This report shows a big increase in contemporary worship styles in America's Protestant churches over the last five years. While 44 percent reported no significant change, 15 percent said their churches had moved in much more contemporary direction, while another 36 percent said their worship had become a little more contemporary. Only 5 percent said their worship had become more traditional during the time period. Contemporary worship outpaced traditional by eleven to one. Larger churches and churches led by vounger ministers were most likely to have shifted toward more contemporary, and Pentecostal churches were over twice as likely to move that way. A big change found was in the use of electronic media computer graphics, music videos, movies, drama, etc. Praise and worship choruses during worship rose from 38 percent in 1999 to 74 percent today. The use of Christian rock, pop, or country music in worship rose from 9 percent five years ago to 25 percent today. Ninetyfive percent of churches pass an offering basket or plate; 88 percent sing traditional hymns; 89 percent celebrate communion; 85 percent use

a printed bulletin or order of service; and 78 percent use hymnals at least once a month. Today the average minister preaches for about 31 minutes. Agape Press via Calvary Contender 4/2004



THE AMERICAN MEGACHURCH - After a rousing live performance of "Jesus is better than Life," broadcast over three Jumbotrons in the Compaq Center, Victoria Osteen steps to the podium in front of 16,000 cheering Sunday worshipers and proclaims: "We're going to rock today. This place has been rocked a lot of times, but it's never been rocked for Jesus."

The Compaq Center took on a new role as city leaders officially turned the keys over to Lakewood church-the largest congregation in the United States, with more than 25,000 attendants each weekend, according to Church Growth Today.

Gone are traditional religious dogma, rituals, and symbols, replaced by uplifting songs and sermons. Congregants are taught that-through God-they are victors, not victims. The messages are encouraging and easy to swallow, and no one is called a sinner. It's "Jesus meets the power of positive thinking." "There's none of that oldtime religion; none of that hell-anddamnation, fire-and-brimstone preaching. The message tends to be more upbeat, one of empowerment. And it seems to be working. These churches are packed," says Alan Wolfe, director of the Boisi Center for Religion and American Public Life at Boston College.

In 1970, there were 10 megachurches nationwide (defined as non-Catholic churches with at least 2,000 weekly attendants). Today there are 740, according to Church Growth Today, a Bolivar, Mo., organization. The Christian Science Monitor 12/03 [Excerpts from "The rise of the American megachurch" by Kris Axtman] via The Berean Call.

WORLD HAS CONVERTED THE CHURCH - Through "contemporary Christian music" and "contemporary worship," the church has been converted to the "religion" of the world! Some of the largest presumably evangelical churches

have designed their Sunday morning services based upon what the ungodly want. Missing are the fear of a holy God's wrath against sin... Seeker-friendly churches must not "offend" with the Truth, but pamper with the flattering "gospel of selfesteem, self-love, and positive thinking—a "gospel" that cannot save. As Paul foretold, 'they will not endure sound doctrine..." (2 Tim. 4:3). Creating large, rich churches is not new.... The Roman Catholic Church—the world's largest and wealthiest—grew out of a marriage between the Roman world and the church, making "Christianity" the state religion. Historian Will Durant explains: "...the world converted Christianity.... [Paganism] passed like maternal blood into the new religion, and captive Rome captured her conqueror..." FRIENDLY SEEKER CHURCHES – This is now all the rage, church services geared to getting in the unsaved. Church is made to order for the ungodly. The churches must be easy-going and entertaining. There is no fear of God; neither is their judgment, sin, repentance or hell! The people they are trying to win will not come and listen to those things. However, one researcher said that in reality, only 10%-15% of the attendees are from among the unchurched. Most of their "converts" are siphoned off from smaller churches, being drawn by the carnal attractions. A recent visitor at one such church spoke of swans gliding across a mirror lake and an extensive eating area supplied by five vendors, where one can watch the

service on a giant screen while enjoying a meal.... Most, if not all, of the churches sponsoring this sort of thing have rock bands, short sermons filled with jokes or amusing stories, a come as you are philosophy, etc. It is religion designed to please the carnal nature of the unsaved. They are getting people in, but they are not bringing people to a true knowledge of Jesus Christ. How can you do that without preaching on sin, hell and repentance? God's message never has been popular - just read the Bible. About one hundred and twenty-five years ago Spurgeon spoke of a similar trend: "The tendency of the time is toward bigness, parade, and show of power... men are getting tired of the divine plan; they are going to be saved by the priest... by the music... by the theatricals.".... Christian *News 5/2004* [Just a thought—Many churches now employ "worship leaders." Musicians, singers and such are the leaders of "worship." Is that Bible? Oh..., what ever happened to the biblical office of PASTOR? - It must have been lost in the *translation(s)* somewhere.]



EINSTEIN CALLED CHRISTIANS "MANIACS" -

The renowned scientist Albert Einstein, who died in 1955, considered Bible-believing Christians "maniacs." This was revealed in the diary of Johanna Fantova, who was known as Einstein's "last girlfriend." The diary was discovered in February at Princeton University's Firestone

Library. Fantova revealed that Einstein spent his last years telling jokes to his parrot and avoiding visitors by feigning illness ("Diary by Einstein's confidante," AP, April 25). The diary also describes how some Christians wrote to Einstein in an attempt to convert him, but he complained, "All the maniacs in the world write to me." COMMISSION WOULD ADD TO LIST OF NATIONS THAT VIOLATE RELIGIOUS

FREEDOM - A watchdog organization on religious liberties recommended that six nations be added to a State Department list of the world's worst violators of religious freedom. The U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom recommended that Eritrea, India, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Turkmenistan and Vietnam be added to the State Department list. The commission, the world's only government-sanctioned organization that investigates and reports on religious freedom, was formed by Congress in 1998 and bases its assessments on provisions of international human rights law. Their recommendation on Saudi Arabia echoes last year's, when it named Saudi Arabia, a U.S. ally, and the world's worst violator of religious freedom. However, Sec. Colin Powell has not added it to the State Department's CPC (Countries of Particular Concern) list. It could not

These last two weeks of April have been exceedingly busy. I interpreted over twenty-five hours of classes, taught a Bible Study Method Class and a Mission Class, held two children's rallies, preached four sermons, helped move the church to a new meeting place, and hung over fifteen light fixtures. 


REPORT FROM VENEZUELA

VA. BAPTISM BAN

The Rev. Todd Pyle thought it was the perfect spot to baptize 12 new members of his church. The river was calm and shallow, and there was a shaded area offshore for people to stand.

"It was a very serene place," he said. "It was special."

But officials at the Falmouth Waterfront Park, a public park just outside Fredericksburg, weren't pleased. They tried to break up the ceremony, claiming it might be offensive to nearby swimmers or other people using the park. Pyle was able to finish the baptism, but then he was asked to leave.

The incident has outraged free-speech advocates.

"These people are being discriminated against because of the content of their speech," said the Rev. Patrick Mahoney, who heads the Christian Defense Coalition. "It's one of the most egregious violations of the First Amendment I have ever seen."

Newspaper 3/2004 Also VOM reports the following: "There has been a new crackdown on unregistered churches that were built before the Chinese Christian Manifesto of 1950. in some of the better Christian Colleges and Institutions the ability to "sing" and "look good" seems of more value than a good testimony and character. Beware!]

LUTHERAN FASHIONS ECUMENICAL ROSARY -

When Dennis Di Mauro's Catholic wife first introduced him to the rosary about seven years ago, he was suspicious. After all, he is Lutheran, and good Lutherans don't pray the rosary. But after experiencing the rosary through a prayer Catholic group, he began fingering the beads and repeating the prayers focusing his mind, and meditating on Jesus' life and death. But Mary's intercessions through the rosary troubled him. He wondered if there was a way to reconfigure the rosary but not "butcher it," in hopes that Protestants and Catholics might find unity in something that has often been divisive. "I don't want to put down the (original) rosary," he insists. "I just want to introduce it to new people. It's really not about my aversion to the original rosary."

So instead of 10 sets of "Hail, Mary, full of grace... pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death," He prays, "Oh my Lord, I know that you are always with me; help me to obey your commandments and lead me to share my faith with others, so that they may know you and love you."

Much of the traditional rosary remains intact with the same beads and some of the same meditative

mysteries. What's missing are the most overt references to Mary, whose prominence in Catholic theology has been a stumbling block for many Protestants for 500 years.

Martin Luther, who launched the 16th century Reformation, had a mixed view of Mary. Scholars say he held her in high regard as a model of faith, and even believed in her perpetual virginity, but rejected her role as a mediator or intercessor between God and man. Even though tradition says he was buried with a rosary, and his symbol features a prominent rose – synonymous with the Virgin Mary – Luther deplored the church's promise of rewards in the hereafter for performing devotions like the rosary.

One professor of Reformation history says, "The way Luther has been interpreted doesn't do justice to how positive he looked on Mary." "But it's safe to say that he would not have approved any kind of prayer to Mary with the hope that Mary would help us. Christ would help us."

So far the reaction has been mostly positive to the Ecumenical Rosary. Conference calls to host group rosary prayers have included Catholics, and "no one has come to me and said, 'Boy, this is heresy," says Di Mauro. His website now gets 250 hits a day and he has mailed out 2.500 how-to brochures to Bible study groups, prison ministries and interfaith groups. Di Mauro is not alone in his rediscovery of beaded prayer. Growing numbers of Protestants are employing prayer beads and repetitive prayer as a way to merge physical sensation with spiritual transcendence. THE **ILLEGAL** "MAZE" – The House on May 18 overwhelmingly rejected a bill to require hospitals to identify illegal aliens before the federal government would reimburse the hospitals for their care. It was a severe defeat for immigration-control advocates, with just 86 Republicans and two Democrats voting for the measure and 331 members voting against it, including the House Republican and Democratic leadership. Rep. Dan Rohrabacher, sponsor of the bill, said the government has an obligation to U.S. citizens and legal residents before taking care of illegal aliens. "If we let this go through as it stands, what is going to happen is this: people who come to the emergency rooms who are American citizens or legal residents who have no insurance will be put at the end of the line, and the illegal immigrants will be put to the front of the line because the federal government is picking up the tab," Rohrabacher said. The proposal also would have required businesses that employed uninsured illegal aliens to cover their treatment costs, and would have told hospitals to send non-emergency patients to their home nation for treatment.

Most medical, hospitals and business groups that weighed in on the bill opposed it. They said it would turn hospital workers into immigration police, and said it could become a public health crisis by encouraging illegal aliens not to seek medical attention. "Let us not jeopardize our entire public health system in this misguided attempt to bring down health care costs and deport undocumented workers," said

Rep. Sanchez.

Mr. Rohrabacher's bill was considered on the House floor under special rules that require a two-thirds vote to pass, but it fell far short. "The thought behind it is correct, but the particular approach in the bill was not the best way to go about it," said Stuart Roy, a spokesman for Majority Leader Tom DeLay. Mr. DeLay voted against the measure. *The Washington Times* 5/04
