*Special appreciation goes to Pastor Patel and Faith Church for their hospitality. The Lord has blessed them with beautiful facilities in the city and at the village church.*



# SHIV NARAYAM

It was one of those hot, dusty days in Agra, India, and God had a divine appointment for his preacher. Pastor Hemant Patel and one of his men, Bro. Thomas, were passing out tracts and sharing the gospel with people along the street. Typically, they would go into the city where there were hundreds of thousands of people to witness to, but that was not the direction the Lord would lead on that day. As they walked out of the city into the rural area, they met a man who rejected their gospel witness but said he knew someone who might be interested. The man led the two preachers to a village to meet a Hindu named Shiv Narayam. Friends and family affectionately referred to this Hindu man as Baba. This was the fortieth day of fasting and prayer for Baba. His Hindu religion had not given him the peace that he was searching for. As Baba looked at one of his Hindu gods, a dog walked by and urinated on the idol. "How could a god allow a dog to do this?" Baba thought in disgust. For forty days Baba would fast and pray for the truth – to know the true God.

Is God real, would He hear

and answer? On the fortieth day of the fast, heaven sent an ambassador halfway around the world to a remote village in India, hidden in the darkest of spiritual night, oppressed by the worst of poverty's woes, and chained to religions slavery. 

### **COCOA BEANS – THE SOURCE OF CHOCOLATE AND HOT COCOA – A VALUED COMMODITY**

– It's war in the West African country of the Ivory Coast. France was the long time colonial power in the Ivory Coast and until recently as many as 14,000 French citizens lived there. A civil war that has been building in recent years embroiled the French earlier when a French base was bombed by the Ivory Coast air force. The French military retaliated by destroying the West African nation's modest collection of air force aircraft.

The French have had some authority conferred upon them by the U.N. to conduct military operations in separating the country's two warring factions: Christian government forces versus Muslim rebels. But lately French officials have been anxious to reduce their country's military profile and would like to bring in peacekeeping forces from other nations to take their place. Sound familiar?

We'll give the French the benefit of the doubt that they're not after the African nation's resources of cocoa beans and coffee, since until

recently they had been preoccupied with plundering Iraqi oil with the assistance of Saddam Hussein and corrupt UN officials. However, it does seem ironic to watch French President Jacques Chirac denounce the Ivory Coast presidential regime 18 months after showing support for the murderous regime of Saddam Hussein.




### **WESTERN MEDIA CHARGED WITH ISSUING "MISINFORMATION"**

– In a report from WorldNetDaily.com 11/20/04 an Iraqi archbishop contended there is no substantial organized resistance among the people and charged the Western media with issuing "misinformation" about his country by focusing only on terrorism carried out largely by foreigners. Chaldean Archbishop Louis Sako of Kirkuk said in an interview with AsiaNews that it's "not all death and destruction" in Iraq, with many anticipating elections as an opportunity for a new beginning.

"Much is positive in Iraq today," he said. "Universities are operating, schools are open, and people go

out onto the streets normally." He insisted, "there is no organized resistance" among Iraqis. "Those who commit such violence are resisting against Iraqis who want to build their country. Iraqis instead are resisting against terrorism and are not carrying out attacks, which instead are the work of foreign infiltrators." Saudis, Jordanians, Syrians, and Sudanese have entered Iraq to fight against coalition forces, he said. And clearly, there are also Iraqi collaborators who, for money, help the terrorist hide. However, the elections in January are an opportunity for a new start, a "new Iraq," he told AsiaNews, but the "Western newspapers and broadcasters are simply peddling propaganda and misinformation." "Why is there so much noise and debate coming out from the West when before, under Saddam, there were no free elections, but no one said a thing?" Sako asked.



**IRAN** – Iran agreed to suspend all uranium enrichment activities pending long-term negotiations with Britain, France, and Germany over the purpose and scope of its nuclear program. But in a closed-door session

in Tehran, conservative mullahs took the chief negotiator to task for acceding to Western demands. "It is not up to the Europeans to decide over our nuclear program or grant us the right to pursue nuclear projects," said Ahmad Tavakoli, member of parliament and a leading critic of the agreement. ### POST-ELECTION SELECTION TRAUMA –

Okay, here we go! The American Health Association has coined a new term and is developing a counseling program for angry and depressed supporters of losing presidential nominee John Kerry. A Florida trauma specialist, Douglas Schooler, told the Boca Raton News, "They were emotionally paralyzed, shocked, and devastated." Thus the AHA has named this problem, "post-election selection trauma."



### 2 MILLION ILLEGAL ALIENS THIS CENTURY

– The Washington Times 12/5/04 reported a 13 percent increase of U.S. immigrants, more than 4 million since 2000. This includes more than 2 million illegal aliens, who now total about 10 million or 30 percent of the immigrant population, according to a report by Steven Camarota, CIS director of research. Maryland was among the eight

states with the largest increases in immigrant population, along with Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, New Jersey, Washington, Arizona and Pennsylvania. CIS, a private research organization that seeks better immigration enforcement, said in the report that the 34.24 million immigrants, both legal and illegal, now in the United States is the highest number ever recorded in American history. It said about half, or 2 million, of the 4.3 million increase since 2000 is estimated to be illegal aliens. The report showed there are roughly 9 million illegal aliens now in the United States.

The report came just two days after President Bush assured Mexico he would expend "political capital" earned in his re-election to push hard to grant temporary guest-worker status to millions of illegal immigrants now in the United States."

- \$561 is how much a private room in a nursing home in Alaska costs a day.....68 cents is how much it costs to produce and mail each Social Security check.....A strong, new cement may be the answer to repairing bones broken or weakened by diseases like osteoporosis. Surgeons have used calcium phosphate cement since the 1980s, but researchers recently discovered that the cement could be made more than three times stronger by adding sodium citrate.....Penn

State University study of women 60 and older show nearly half of this healthy group deficit in iron. Breathlessness and fatigue, as well as, frequent infections and problems with concentrating were symptoms in the deficit group. Namanjeet Ahluwalia, who led the study, suggests women drink orange juice with meals to boost the absorption of iron from chicken, fish, red meat, beans and iron-fortified breads and cereals. ### HOW COULD NEANDERTHAL MAN BE "TOO" ADVANCED FOR EVOLUTION?

– In southern France, they recently found evidence of human habitation hundreds of feet deep within a cave. What makes this find so important is that it's been dated as the earliest signs of humans in Europe. Only the Neanderthals were thought to be the inhabitants of Europe at that time.

What they found in the cave was astonishing for such so-called "primitive" people. They found a "complex quadrilateral artificial structure consisting of specially arranged pieces of stalactite and stalagmite." Also found was a piece of burned bear bone.

Now for the problem. The items were so deep in the cave, that the people would have had to have some kind of artificial light, such as a fire, torch or lamp. Also, the structure they found was so complex, it would have required the builders to be able to communicate with each other.

Such language skill and technological know-how easily fits the creationist understanding of Neanderthals. They were a line of early humans living after the Flood and descended from Noah—but evolutionists have long held that Neanderthals could not possibly have done these things. **PRO-LIFE VICTORY** – Over the November 20-21, 2004 weekend, Congress passed legislation stipulating that state and local governments cannot coerce hospitals, insurers and other health care groups into performing or supporting abortions. The provision expands a federal law stipulating that a doctor can opt out of abortion training. It will deny federal funds to any federal agency, state or local government that discriminates against a health care entity because that entity does not provide, pay for or support abortions. Entities include hospitals, insurers, health maintenance organizations (HMOs) and health care facilities.

### PARTIAL-BIRTH ABORTION ACT

– Earlier this year a lone U.S. District Judge rules that the Partial-Birth Abortion Act, which was passed by Congress and signed into law by President Bush last fall, was unconstitutional because it "poses an undue burden on a woman's right to choose an abortion." Federal judges in New York and Nebraska issued similar rulings, blocking enforcement

“One unaccountable judge should not be allowed to usurp the will of the American people, especially when exhaustive factual findings clearly indicate that this horrific procedure is never medically necessary,” said Brad Dacus, President of the Pacific Justice Institute. Our organization gladly stands with those who are fighting to preserve the sanctity of human life and have now filed an amicus brief in the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit U.S. District courts of Appeal. **THE “SELLING” OF ISLAM**

– Two limousines pulled up outside the United Artists theater in Brooklyn Heights. There was no red carpet, not even a poster announcing the film that opened there and at 92 other theaters

around the country.

But for thousands of Muslims who flocked to those theaters, the American premiere of the animated feature “Muhammad: the Last Prophet,” was unquestionably a landmark cultural event. The 90-minute movie, which recounts the story of the birth of Islam, began as the dream of a Saudi real estate investor, Muwaffak Alharithy, who said he felt that his children and other Muslim youth had been shortchanged by religious film offerings of Hollywood and decided to remedy the situation himself.

In 1999, Mr. Alharithy hired a veteran director of Hollywood animated films, Richard Rich, whose movies include “The King and I” and “The Fox and the Hound.” Mr. Alharithy said he ultimately spent \$12 million to produce the feature, only to find American distributors hesitant in the aftermath of 9/11. “What we found out in making the film is how little anybody knows about that religion and Muhammad,”

Mr. Rich said in an interview. “Here we thought that this film would at least open doors for that to happen, and then 9/11 seemed to close those doors for a while.”

Both local and national Muslim leaders said they hoped non-Muslims would see the film. Debbie Almontaser, a Brooklyn activist who teaches cultural tolerance in New York City schools and for the organization Women in Islam, said the fact that so many American theaters opened their doors was a good sign.

Dr. James Zogby, president of the Arab American Institute in Washington, said, “Islam is a part of America right now and America is increasingly becoming a part of the Arab and Muslim world.” He added: “This is what globalization is about. It’s not a one-way sell. **THE IMPORTANCE OF SUNDAY**

One of the Ten Commandments is “Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy.” That was under the Law; but when Jesus was resurrected on the first day of the week, Sunday, the day itself was changed “Sabbath” to “the Lord’s day,” but the commandment did not change. It is still six days of labor and one of rest.

However, we have mostly made it a day of frolicking and buying. The biggest sports events are on Sunday. The Blue Law has been abolished in almost every state. I am sure the biggest majority of folks you see at Wal-Marts on Sunday are church members.

The First Day of the week was when the Lord’s last Supper was remembered. “And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them” (Acts 20:7). The tithe was also to be gathered up on the first day of the week.

It is of importance that we read that the Last Supper and Christ’s second coming are somewhat tied together. “For as oft as ye eat this bread and drink this cup, ye do shew forth the Lord’s death till he come” (1Cor. 11:26). In at least three of the gospels, Jesus made it plain that He would not drink of the cup nor eat of the bread until He do so anew in His Father’s kingdom. There is this one day in the week that the Lord’s second coming and His Supper are closely associated.

Jesus was not only resurrected on the first day of the week (Sunday) but it was on that same day he appeared to Mary. That afternoon two of His disciples were on the road to Emmaus when He appeared to them (Luke 24:15).

It was on the first day of the week (Sunday) that His disciples were gathered together when Jesus suddenly

# No-Fault(?) Divorce

## Another Perspective

Excuse me, but this issue of divorce continues to come up. Yes, marriage, the sanctity of marriage, a federal amendment and still the homosexual, in your face, law or no law militancy continues the buzz. The subject of divorce as well as divorce and remarriage has been dealt with on numerous occasions in this publication. As recent as February 2004, a lengthy article by this editor was printed. It is always interesting to hear the comments of those who move in entirely different circles of life. My wife brought the following comments to my attention. This is an excerpt from Michael Reagan's book, *Twice Adopted*. No endorsement here, but just given as information and obviously some very interesting background on this subject.

"Is No-Fault at Fault?" What can we do to prevent kids from being damaged by divorce? Well, the first and most obvious piece of advice is: Don't get a divorce!...

"The problem is that we have made divorce too easy in our society. We have greased the skids of marriage so that it has become easy for people to slide away from their responsibilities, their marriage vows, and their duty to provide a stable, secure home for their children. And

do you know who's responsible for making divorce too easy? Would you believe—Ronald Reagan?

"Until 1969, almost every state in the Union had a fault-based system of divorce laws. (The lone exception was Oklahoma, which introduced no-fault divorce in 1953). Under the fault-based system, a plaintiff (the aggrieved party in the divorce action) had to charge the defendant with certain actions that constituted grounds for divorce. Those grounds might include mental cruelty, physical abuse, desertion, adultery, imprisonment, alcohol or drug addiction, or insanity. Without showing grounds for divorce, no divorce could be granted.

"California's no-fault divorce law was drafted by Assemblyman James A. Hayes and signed into law in 1969 by then-Governor Ronald Reagan. The rest of the nation quickly followed California's lead. By 1974, forty-five states had passed no-fault statutes of their own. By 1985, every state in the union was a no-fault state. According to Judy Parejko, author of *Stolen Vows: The Illusion of No-Fault Divorce and the Rise of the American Divorce Industry*, Assemblyman Hayes "was responsible for doggedly pursuing 'the no-fault divorce' bill because he was facing a divorce and he didn't like the rules at the time. Nowadays,

his actions would be called a conflict of interest.

And why did Ronald Reagan, the pro-family conservative, sign such a law? I believe that some of his reasons were personal. Notice that Dad signed the no-fault divorce law some twenty years after going through his own divorce. His wife, Jane Wyman, had divorced him on grounds of "mental cruelty." Even though listing grounds for divorce was largely a formality, those two words were probably a bitter pill for him to swallow. He wanted to do something to make the divorce process less acrimonious, less contentious, and less expensive.

"Dad later said that he regretted signing the no-fault divorce bill and that he believed it was one of the worst mistakes he ever made in office. That law set in motion one of the worst mistakes he ever made in office. That law set in motion one of the most damaging social experiments in the history of our nation. Not only did the divorce rate skyrocket as a direct result of the no-fault experiment, but divorce conflicts and legal costs remain as ruinous as ever. The acrimony in divorce has simply shifted to different issues. Instead of fighting over who gets blamed for what, couples battle primarily over custody, visitation rights, and child support.

“According to a nationwide survey conducted by *The Journal of Marriage and the Family*, the divorce rate soared by 250 percent over a twenty-year period from 1960 to 1980. There is only one factor with nationwide implications that could have caused such a dramatic shift in the divorce rate: the national movement to no-fault divorce.

“Today roughly half of all marriages end in divorce - 40 percent of first marriages (versus 16 percent in 1960), and 60 percent of remarriages. Three-fifths of all divorces affect the lives of minor children. By making divorce easier to obtain, the no-fault divorce laws have created a lucrative ‘divorce industry’ that impoverishes families (including children) while enriching divorce lawyers.”

appeared in their midst. These three very important showings were made by Him on Sunday, the first day of the week.

The next Sunday, He appeared again to His disciples, and Thomas was present for this showing (John 20:26).

The church was established on the first day of the week which was on the day of Pentecost and that occasion was always on Sunday, the first day of the week.

The first gospel message was preached on Sunday as was the first baptism by the authority of Christ for the remission of sins.
