

60 MILLION GIRLS MISSING IN ASIA - Sherry Karabin of Fox News writes that according to the UN Population Fund, practices such as abortion, prenatal gender selection, and female infanticide are leading to a shortage of females in the continent of Asia. Mrs. Karabin wrote that these practices are "creating a gender imbalance and other serious problems that experts say will have far reaching consequences for years to come." TRAITORS OR "FIFTH COLUMN"- In Dallas, TX, a federal judge has declared a mistrial in a case the federal government brought against the Holy Land Foundation for Relief and Development (HLF), a Muslim charity accused of funding terrorism. The hung jury, which could not reach a verdict on the 197 counts brought against the HLF, doesn't mean that the group is innocent of the charges brought against it. The government has indicated that it will retry the case against the foundation. This is just the latest of organizations that have been funded by overseas money; others include the quick construction of mosques and Islamic schools here in the US. A TARNISHED COMPASS-

A movie released in December 2007 called The Golden Compass is a movie that has been promoted as a "Family Film." But we need to look at the author of the books that the movie is based on. Philip Pullman, who has described himself as an agnostic and atheist, said, "I don't profess any religion; I don't think it's possible that there is a God; I have the greatest difficulty in understanding what is meant by the words 'spiritual' or 'spirituality."" Peter Hitchens, a conservative British columnist, called Pullman "The Most Dangerous Author in Britain" and went on to describe

him as a writer "the atheists would have been praying for, if atheists prayed." *The Golden Compass*, called *Northern Lights* in Britain, is part of Pullman's *His Dark Materials* trilogy of children's books. When talking about his books, Mr. Pullman said, "My books are about killing God" and that he was "trying to undermine the basis of Christian belief." WOMEN'S RIGHTS- In 2006. a Saudi woman was to meet a male friend. After their meeting, 7 Arab men captured and raped both people abducted. The woman, instead of being treated fairly by the courts in Saudi Arabia, was sentenced to 90 lashes. Upon appeal by her lawyer, the higher court increased the sentence to 6 months in prison and 200 lashes for meeting her friend in private, according to Qur'anic teaching. According to Aiyah Saihati, research fellow at the Cato Institute, the flogging is a punishment of a person who committed zena, a interchangeable term for fornication and adultery.

In this case, zena was not proved. The courts are now going after the woman's lawyer for representing her in the case. *ABC News* reported on December 17, 2007, that Saudi Arabian King Abdullah pardoned the woman in this case, without, however, condemning or overturning the verdict of the court. <u>www.arabnews.com</u> 12/12/07

DEFEND - Students at Brigham Young University were told that they must be ready to defend their moral stands on abortion, samesex marriage and moral relativity. Oxford University's Professor Daniel Robinson addressed 200 students saying, "It's important you recognize the burden you have on you. You must be informed. Adversaries of everything you stand for are often informed, often passionate." Robinson, who is not a Mormon, called the university "an estimable institution, for which the nation has every reason to be grateful." Continuing to address the students, the professor said, "One need not be defensive about one's faith. One need not be defensive about what one is trying to bring about in the world. What one is trying to bring about is a world in which children are educated, not raped, in which they go on the Internet to learn things that would be difficult to uncover even in the

Library of Congress, not to be exposed to obscenity, pornography, things that corrupt and astound and numb the senses and render the most intimate associations in life merely carnal. This is what you're fighting, and you better fight it hard enough and with the intellectual and moral resources required by that fight, so that your children have a world that one doesn't hope to leave early, do you see, because it is so disgusting and depraved and defocused. It isn't enough to have the right sentiments. It isn't enough to have the right scripture. You have to have the right argument, because you will face those who think nothing of your scripture. You cannot win an argument by waving a book at someone. You understand that. You must prepare yourselves." www.desertnews.com 12/12/07 {Editor: What about you? Are you "ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you?" (I Peter 3:15) As Christians, we need to know where we stand and why.}

ONE GOD?- In an interview with Elie Nakouzi of Al Arabiya TV, President Bush said, "I believe there is a universal God. I believe the God that the Muslim prays to is the same God that I pray to." Sadly, that very lack of Biblical knowledge and

THE PRINTED MISSIONARY

The title of "*the most spoken language on earth*" presently alternates between Chinese and English within each twenty-four hour cycle. When the sun is over the western Pacific, the most spoken language is Chinese. When the sun is over the Atlantic and China sleeps, the most spoken language is English.

The next category of language, in terms of demographic importance, includes two "pairs" of languages with combined totals of more than half a billion (500,000,000) speakers. The first of these comprises Hindi & Urdu, which are inter-intelligible when spoken in spite of their different scripts. If allowance is made for the comprehension of spoken Hindi and Urdu by speakers of the closely related Panjabi language, and of other languages in the Indic set, as well as for the widespread passive understanding of Hindi among speakers of Dravidian languages, then Hindi & Urdu has its place in the same category of Chinese and English, and a language with around one billion "hearers"

The second pair of languages with over half a billion speakers is composed of *Spanish & Portuguese*.

the company of those that published it." Psalm 68:11

After nearly two millenniums of evangelism, over 50% of the world's population has never heard the Gospel. It is estimated that an average foreign missionary has an outreach to only 5,000 people during his tenure. At that rate, we would need to send a million more missionaries to the field this year. This is probably humanly impossible.

God has the key – a means of giving the message to "*every creature*" in a meaningful, relevant, heart-reaching manner. God does not give commands that are impossible to fulfill. With every command given, God also makes available everything necessary to complete it. A key to many countries, languages, and people groups is the printed page.

In America, the printed page has become "cheap" and has been taken for granted. This is not true in many foreign fields. In Latin America, for example, one can walk through the villages and towns and pass out literature wherever there are people and the message will be read on the spot. It is not uncommon for people to actually approach the missionary and ask for a piece of Gospel literature. In Central America there is one response to every one hundred pieces of literature passed out. In Mexico there is an average of one letter to every two hundred pieces of literature distributed. There is nothing that produces such results, in

regards to time and money expended, as Gospel literature.

The greatest invention of all time is the printing press. How fitting that the first thing printed on Gutenberg's first press 567 years ago was the Bible. Gutenberg wrote in the 15th century, "God suffers because of the great multitudes whom His sacred Word cannot reach. Religious truth is captive in a small number of manuscript books which guard the treasures. Let us break the seal which holds the holy things; give wings to the truth that by a means no longer written at great expense by the hand that wearies itself, but multiplied by an unwearied machine, it may fly to every soul born in the world." The God-given purpose and vision of the man who invented the first printing press was world evangelism.

The greatest miracle of our generation is literacy. Over 3 million new people learn to read every 7 days – more than 150 million a year. They will read something – anything! They will be reached, and it is simply a question of who will reach them first.

Many nations now have mass, nation-wide literacy campaigns. Indonesia, with 838 languages, has a national language. Almost all the schools of the country are now bilingual – classes in Indonesian and the local tribal language. In 15 years, Indonesia went from 6% literacy to 67% of the population who can read and write. Some of the African nations have jumped from being 85% illiterate to being 52% literate.

and guns, and planes, but a war of WORDS. The weapons are paper and ink; the victims are the minds of men, and the struggle is ideological. This is a day when conflicting forces are striving for world mastery and it is imperative for them to win the allegiance of men's minds. The millions of people who grope for guidance are an open prey. They search, not knowing where a sure word of counsel is to be found. In their search many are being deceived by the clever, lying propaganda of the devil in the guise of "isms," sects and cults.

Early missionaries blazed a trail for literature evangelism. In recent years, though, we have allowed the cults and the Communists to use this weapon which was forged by many of God's pioneers. The Father of modern missions William Carey, founded a printing press and devoted much of his life to literature work. Today in India 70% of all literature in some areas is Communistic.

Charles Darwin wrote a book called *Origin of the Species*. Evolution is now taught, even though a theory, in every state university and college; as well as in most public schools in the world. The belief in God has been affected in one billion young people by one book.

Karl Marx wrote just one book – *Das Kapital*. Almost two billion souls, in at least 20 countries, have lost their freedom and have had to lie under a totalitarian regime because of this one book. It has been responsible for 100 million deaths.

The biggest propaganda machine of the Communists is the printing

Conduct During playing- During a rendition of the national anthem:

- (1) When the flag is displayed -
 - (a) All present except those in uniform should stand at attention facing the flag with the right hand over the heart;
 - (b) Men not in uniform should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold the headdress at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart; and;
 - (c) Individuals in uniform should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note: and;
- (2) When the flag is not displayed, all present should face toward the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed.}

India- Always Emotional

If you have ever traveled to India you can understand what I describe as a journey of the senses. The sights, the sounds, the smells – every sense is elevated beyond the norm. Even mentally and emotionally India is a land of the dramatic. It goes without saying that India is a place of intense religion punctuated by the extreme and bizarre. I was trying to take inventory of the past mission trips I've been privileged to take part in since 1997. This was about my eighth trip to India. Now I can truly say that I have some very precious friendships among my brothers and sisters in Christ in the country of India. This was also my wife's second trip to India. We had the opportunity to meet with the pastors, preach and briefly visit the village. I'll share more about that later.

Due to our scheduled departure from the Raleigh/Durham airport being on a Monday morning, we decided to drive to Raleigh and spend the night on Sunday. Thankfully, I had enough motel miles to pay for our accommodations. It was our plan to stop at a friend's church en route. This is a church I have preached in at

least twice in the past. There is now a new pastor and I had not visited there in several years. Again this is an article about emotion, and our experience on that Sunday morning was one of dismay and sadness. To make a long story short I was shocked to see a drama presentation incorporating choreographed moves to very contemporary music by a team of young people. Quite frankly, it was nothing short of dance. I never anticipated anything like that. It is indeed a sad day when churches that I personally have preached in have taken such a worldly direction.

Well, that's the start of the emotion. Thankfully, from there the journey improves. It was a joy to have Dennis and Vonnie Jones accompany my wife and me on this first MissionVue to India. The fellowship was good, and I pray this close up and personal look at missions will benefit many through the testimony of this dear couple.

"Welcome to American Eagle, your one world alliance and airline partner." For a Bible student that is certainly a catchy announcement. We are not only looking for the second coming of Christ, but with great anticipation, the Christ of the second coming. Even so come Lord Jesus. I never cease to be amazed as Bible prophecy is constantly evident in the day in which we live. Former President George H. W. Bush often used that one world term. Just the other day, he was the very one to introduce former Gov. Mitt Romney as Romney attempted to cover-up the deceptiveness of Mormonism. These are certainly perilous times but also times of great opportunity. With the thoughts of Christ coming again, we are indeed to be comforted by one another.

On November 5, 2007, Terry and I left for India with a stop over in London. As many of our readers know, Bro. Royce became involved in India many years ago supporting Major Gardner, the church in Howrah, Chinsurah, and the orphanage work. Today the Lord continues to open doors for The Voice in the Wilderness on this key gospel frontier. Please take time to read the enclosed article "The Printed Missionary" as an introduction to some of our work in India. During our stop over in England, I was reminded of how vigilant we must be. On the front of The Voice in the Wilderness publication you will notice the two phrases Contending for Fundamental Christianity and American Freedom Here lies the

emotion of it all. When I exchanged some money, I received a very interesting coin from England with the impression of Elizabeth II. On this two-pound coin the inscription on the edge of the coin stated, "Standing on the Shoulders of Giants." To my shock the ten-pound paper note had the picture of none other than Charles Darwin. Today across England, Scotland, Wales, and Ireland, there is a great need for Bible preaching. Countless churches have closed across the UK with new Mosques opening almost daily. A country that once enjoyed the blessings of true giants of the faith has now been indoctrinated with secularism and the things of this world. Charles Spurgeon preached to throngs in London, while now the picture of Charles Darwin is printed on their money. Exactly who are the giant shoulders they stand upon?

The emotion goes beyond the sad, spiritual condition of England. Presently missionaries are attempting to raise their support to go to the UK and plant new churches. However, the U.S. dollar is worth about fifty cents in England, dramatically diminishing the missionary's support. Those who have been traveling across America preaching in churches and sharing God's call to the UK for the past three or four years now find themselves in a deficit situation financially. Pray for this urgent need and for the Godly men and women who have a burden and vision to

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY January

During the War for Independence, General Washington's southern army was defeated by the British at Cowpens on January 17, 1781. Lord Cornwallis, commander of the British troops, chased the defeated army and was just two hours behind after the Americans crossed the Catawba River in South Carolina. A sudden storm made the river impassable. Again at the Yadkin River, the British nearly caught the American army, but a hammering rain flooded the river. The third time the American army was almost caught was at the Dan River. British Commander Henry Clinton recorded what happened: "Here the royal army was again stopped by a sudden rise of the waters, which had only just fallen (almost miraculously) to let the enemy over." General Washington remembered the circumstances similar to these during the War in a note to Brigadier General Thomas Nelson in August 1778 writing, "The Hand of Providence has been so conspicuous in all this (the course of the war) that he must be worse than an infidel that lacks faith, and more wicked that has not gratitude to acknowledge his obligations; but it will be time enough for me to turn Preacher when my present appointment ceases."

February

On February 12, 1809, two notable men in history were born. One believed that all men are not equal because some are more evolved; the other believed "that all persons held as slaves {should} be free to abstain from all violence..., ...and {should be allowed to} labor faithfully for reasonable wages." By now you may have figured out that these two men are Charles Darwin and Abraham Lincoln. Darwin is known for his theory of evolution, which is being used by atheists to explain away God and absolutes; Lincoln is remembered for the Emancipation Proclamation and the signing of the act to place the phrase "In God We Trust" on all of our national coins.

PRESIDENTIAI LEGACIES

General Daniel E. Sickles has recorded for us this intimate revelation from the heart of the *Great Emancipator*. The General had been severely wounded on July 2, 1863, and after suffering the amputation of a leg, was removed to Washington where he was visited by the President. We quote from General Sickles:



Mr. Lincoln, we heard at Gettysburg that here at the capitol you were all so anxious about the results of the battle that the government officials packed up and got ready to leave at short notice with the official archives.

"Yes", he said. "Some precautions were prudently taken; but for my part I was sure of our success at Gettysburg."

"Why," I asked, "were you so confident? The army of the

Potomac had suffered many reverses."

There was a pause. The President seemed in deep meditation. His pale face was lighted up by an expression I had not observed before. Turning to me he said:

"When Lee crossed the Potomac and entered Pennsylvania followed by our army, I felt the crisis had come. I know that defeat in a great battle on Northern soil involved the loss of Washington, to be followed, perhaps, by the intervention of England and France in favor of the Southern Confederacy. I went to my room and got down on my knees in prayer. Never before had I prayed with so much earnestness. I wish I could repeat my prayer.

press. They spend over three billion dollars annually on printing. They print three pieces of literature for every man, woman, boy, and girl upon the earth every year. In one large Latin America country they have 22 daily Communist newspapers and 32 weekly publications. In Mexico City alone, there are at least 28 communist bookstores. Most state fairs in Latin America have a bookstand operated by the Russian Embassy.

When Lenin took over Russia he said, "The people will never believe or understand Communism unless they are indoctrinated with Communism by the printed page." The Communists proudly boast, "Let the missionaries teach the people to read; we will provide them with literature."

The Jehovah's Witnesses have an eight floor print shop in Brooklyn, NY, housing the largest printing press in the world.

Seventh Day Adventists operate at least forty-three printing plants around the world.

The editor of the <u>Catholic Register</u> not only runs the biggest but also the most successful chain of religious newspapers in the world.

The words of Daniel Webster are as appropriate today as they were 100 years ago: "If religious books are not widely circulated among the masses in this country I do not know what is to become of us as a nation. And the thought is one to cause solemn reflection on the part of every Christian and patriot. If truth is not diffused, error will be. If God and His Word are not known and received, the devil and his works will gain the ascendancy. If the evangelical volume does not reach every hamlet, the pages of a corrupt and licentious literature will. If the power of the Gospel is not felt through the length and breadth of the land, anarchy and misrule, degradation and misery, corruption and darkness will reign without mitigation or end."

T.E. Floyd, former British Home Secretary of the African Inland Mission said, "Christian literature is today's absolute number one priority in all missionary planning." Dr. Harold Cook, the late Missions Department Chairman of Moody Bible Institute said, "Literature can be our most effective medium of mass communication of the Gospel. In terms of the price paid for it, the number of people reached, and the fact that the message can be read over and over again until it is understood, there is no other method that can compare with literature.

"For more that fifty years I have prayerfully considered the problem: How can we evangelize the world in the space of one generation? Long ago I was convinced that we could never send out enough missionaries. But there must be a way. After travel and study in 53 countries, I have come to the conclusion: the only way we are going to be able to carry out the Great commission, 'Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature,' will be by means of the printed page. By the systematic use of the printed page we shall be able to enter every home and thus reach every

individual with the Gospel message." (Dr. J. Oswald Smith)

The message of salvation can be presented through means of the printed page. It never flinches, it never grows tired, never grows disheartened; it works while we sleep; it travels cheaply and requires no rented building; it never loses it's temper, and it works long after we are dead. The printed page is a visitor which gets inside the home and stays there. It always catches a man in the right mood, for it speaks to him only when he is reading it. It always sticks to what it said and never answers back.

The printed page is deathless. You can destroy one but the press can reproduce millions and as soon as it is martyred, it is raised. It can enter doors locked to the evangelist. It preaches in the factory, the train, and the kitchen. It visits the school and the jail and whispers in the ear of the dying.

The printed message can reach those whose religions forbid them to go to church. It can reach the student who, proud of his intellectualism, refuses to listen to the Gospel or relate himself to it for fear of his fellow students or professors. Away from searching eyes, away from the probing investigations of the state, away from the demands of superstitious religion, away from the critical intrusions of friends and family, the message of salvation can be read and understood.

Tomorrow many missionaries will have to leave their field, but their witness can remain. A link – LITERATURE – can be left in the hands of national Christians, sensitive to their responsibility and equipped to reach those masses who long for hope beyond their darkness.

Education has become compulsory for school-age children in most countries.

The way to reach the most in the shortest period of time is with the printed page. Certainly this does not imply that we should neglect other means of evangelism, but the churches of America and the world should awake to the importance of the printed page. It is time to take massive projects, systematically covering countries and metropolitan areas with the printed page. Do not send your missionary to the battlefield without ammunition.

If God trusted the revelation of the Living Word to the written Word, then so can we. The size and urgency of our task demands the use of the mass media of literature. *"He is not willing that any should perish."*

"I felt that I must put all my trust in Almighty God. He gave our people the best country ever given to man. He alone could save it from destruction. I had tried my best to do my duty and found myself unequal to the task. The burden was more than I could bear. God had often been our Protector in other days. I prayed that He would not let the nation perish. I asked Him to help us and give us the victory now. I felt that my prayer was answered. I had no misgivings about the result of Gettysburg."



Nobody could mistake the first President of the United States. He was described as "First in war, first in peace, first in the hearts of his countrymen." When only 14 or 15 years of age, George Washington copied from an English translation of a French book of maxims "110 Rules of Civility and Decent Behavior in Company and Conversation." He exhibited noble manners throughout his life. Rule #108 states, "When you speak of God, or His attributes, let it be seriously and with reverence. Honor and obey your parents although they be poor." His mother admonished young George to "Remember that God is our only sure trust. To Him, I commend you . . . my son, neglect not the duty of secret prayer." Later, General Washington of the Continental Army appointed chaplains to every regiment with hope and trust "that every officer and many, will endeavor so to live. and act as becomes a Christian soldier. . ." Washington held high the standard of morality and good behavior for his officers and men. Gambling, intemperance and profanity received swift punishment. "Any soldier found drunk shall receive one hundred lashes, without benefit of a courtmartial," were his orders in 1756. Revisionists along with Hollywood have attempted to pervert the character of Washington. Ample documentation and testimony is available to prove the man "true to himself, true to his country, true to his God "

REPUBLICAN FLIP-FLOP -

Many of you may remember that in the last presidential election, a candidate was labeled for flipflopping on the issues. Now, a leading candidate in the Republican Party is accused of doing the same thing. When Mike Huckabee was governor of Arkansas, he and other politicians said that the trade embargo against Cuba was horrible for business. Now, he favors the embargo, believed to be an effort to satisfy Cuban exiles that live in Florida. While governor, Mr. Huckabee supported in-state tuition for children of illegal immigrants and defended illegal workers caught in a raid in a meatpacking plant. Currently, he would like to have illegals returned to their native countries within 120 days after being caught. About his flip-flopping, the former governor said, "Rather than seeing it as some huge change, I would call it, rather, the simple reality that I'm running for president of the United States, not for reelection as governor of Arkansas. I've got to look at this as an issue that touches the whole country." About the illegal immigrants, Mr. Huckabee proposes that those who

do not return to their home country within the 120 days will be barred from future reentry to the US for 10 years after being caught; those who went home would have no repercussions imposed upon them. *Los Angeles Times 12/11/07*



WHO IS TO BLAME?-Climate scientists at the Universities of Rochester, Alabama and Virginia discovered that the human influence on global warming is not as dramatic as thought. This is different from the view that Al Gore and his group are proposing. When accepting the Nobel Prize, Mr. Gore said, "We must quickly mobilize our civilization with the urgency and resolve that has previously been seen only when nations mobilized for war." His solution is to have nations tax carbon dioxide emissions and not build any new coal plants. Fred Singer of the University of Virginia, one of the three writers of the report, said, "Our findings basically are that fingerprints-that is to say the pattern of warming- that's predicted by greenhouse models does not match the fingerprints

of observations, so there is a disconnect between greenhouse models and the actual reality of observations. This means that the greenhouse effect-while real- is not very important in producing climate change. It's a lot smaller than what the models calculate." Bracken Hendricks, a senior fellow at the Center for American progress (a liberal group), said, "The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC the group associated with Gore) is not just a report. It's not just a random gathering of scientists. It's the largest scientific body ever assembled. Their most recent assessment determined that there's 90% certainty that global climate change is happening and that it is caused by human beings." Mr. Singer responded by saying, "We have to remember that the climate has always been changing ever since we have records, and we have geologic records going back millions and millions of years. We know that there have been huge climate changes on the earth long before human beings actually came into existence. We are fairly sure that what's causing the warming are changes in the sun. These are very subtle changes that are very difficult to observe. no longer treating them? Many physicians say they simply can't afford to. This is partly because the formula for Medicare payments to doctors is flawed. Since 2000, Part B premiums have doubled, and they will rise another 3.1 percent in 2008. These increases (a cumulative 106 percent – from \$43.80 a month in 1998 to \$96.40 a month in 2008) far surpass the increases in the Social Security cost-of-living adjustments (21 percent) –*AARP Bulletin*

But thank the Lord, no serious injury. Adjustments were made for the faulty seatbelt and travel proceeded.

Preaching, teaching and meetings- it's hit the ground running. Always a joyous time to see the pastors, brothers and sisters so precious to us in the Lord. These reunions are such happy times. However, at least 7 of those The Voice in the Wilderness has worked with over the years are now with the Lord. We miss them but rejoice that they have finished their course. 


