

Healing of Centurian's Servant

"Please don't die, my servant!" cried the Roman Centurion. (A centurion is a boss over 100 soldiers.) The Centurion cared very much about his servant.




Friends came to visit. "Jesus of Nazareth is coming to town!" they said.




"He touches people and they are healed," said one. "He commands the demons to leave and they obey," said another.




"Why are you standing here?" gasped the centurion. "Go get him!" Quickly the friends ran to meet Jesus.




"Please come and heal a slave. His master is a Roman centurion and he loves our people. He built us a synagogue!" "Okay, I'll go," answered Jesus.


