That day we gave our hearts and lives to the country of Old Mexico and the lives of our daughters. We didn't realize then that God would raise up such a great work that he has over the years. I knew that God had laid the burden on our hearts to start Churches and train national pastors to pastor them.

## GOD'S BLESSINGS HAVE BEEN MANY

God called our daughters their husbands our grandson and his wife to be Missionaries here. He also called a national and his wife. We are now five families starting Churches. There are over 80 Churches that have been started and many of the Churches have Missions out of their Churches they go to them once a week to have services and take them to the main Church on Sunday. Many of the Churches are self supporting and have good mission programs.

## STARTING CHURCHES

Our plans are to keep starting churches until God calls us home or he returns to take us home. Beverly and I have been a part in helping start 31 churches from the ground up and they all have a national Pastor.

## THE SEMINARY

The Seminary has been such a blessing to the work. There have been 181 students graduate from the Seminary. We started it in 1987 in our home and moved it in 1999 when Ruben and Valerie took it over. Our daughter and her husband. There are also 4 night Seminaries in different parts of the city two nights a week. There are a good number of students that study at night.
